WATERLOO PARKS COMMISSION - MINUTES

December 4, 2024

- 1. ROLL CALL AND CALL TO ORDER. Parks Coordinator Haberkorn called the Parks Commission meeting to order at 5:04 pm in the Municipal Building Council Chambers. ROLL CALL: Voting members present: Setz, Vieth, Quamme, Kegler, & Weihert. Absent: None. Ex-officio members present: Parks Coordinator Gabe Haberkorn and DPW Director Chad Yerges. Absent: Friends of Firemen's Park President Jessica Pickel & WYSO Representative Otto Degler. Others present: Carol Zimbric, Maureen Giese, Mary Schaefer, & Charles Crave.
- MEETING MINUTES APPROVAL: OCTOBER 2, 2024. MOTION: Moved by Setz, seconded by Kegler. VOICE VOTE: Motion Carried 5-0.
- 3. CITIZEN INPUT: PARK Coordinator Haberkorn presented a plaque to long-time Park Commissioner Charles Crave for his years of service to the Parks Department and Parks Commission.

4. REPORTS/UPDATES:

- a. Coordinator's Report: Haberkorn spoke about the new door replacement at the Firemen's Park Pavilion, that the doors are now at the pavilion and waiting for installation. Haberkorn touched base on the Carousel and sending of parts to be refabricated to Carousel Carvings in Ohio to go along with the crankshafts. Haberkorn spoke on the upcoming Park Events for the Holiday Parade and Community Party.
- b. Parks Financial Report: Haberkorn talked about the status of the budget for 2024 and pointed to the final report of the budget with Tax Levy and Designated Funds Applied for the payback of our loan have not been rectified for 2024. Setz asked when payments usually come in from Finance. Haberkorn stated that those payments have been made in the Spring and the 2nd installment in August in previous years. Discussion
- c. 2024 Capital Projects: Haberkorn asked if we could skip the discussion of Capital Projects as it is a part of New Business in the next section. Discussion. MOTION: Weihert moved to take 4C and 5A together, seconded by Quamme. Motion Carried 5-0.

5. NEW BUSINESS:

- a. 2025 Capital Projects: Haberkorn spoke about the Finance Committee wanting to see different items on the Capital Projects list than what the Parks Commission had put forward for the 2025 Budget. Kegler spoke on the wants of the Parks Commission and what was the purpose of the Parks Commission. Haberkorn talked about the Parks Capital Project being cut \$45,000 for 2025 for other needs within the City of Waterloo Budget. Weihert asked about the colors of the Capital Project list and asked for a title on the top column for it. Mary Schaefer asked what things bring in the most money and spoke about fixing those problems first in the Capital Projects list. Discussion. MOTION: None.
- b. 2025 Events Policy: Maureen Giese opened the discussion and presented a letter to the Parks Commission. Giese spoke on the history of Waterloo, its Homecomings, and Firemen's Park. Carol Zimbric spoke next and asked what the issues are, if it is cost or more specifics. Haberkorn answered by discussing the costs of the Fireworks from tax levy and the amount of people that are not citizens of Waterloo who view the fireworks and do not spend the day in Firemen's Park. Mary Schaefer asked if they would be moved to a different day like Weiner & Kraut Day. Haberkorn discussed Weiner & Kraut Day numbers along with Kegler talking about visitors staying at the park the entire day. Gabe,

Thank you for taking time to meet again to revise the quote for adding cameras to Fireman's park pavilion, bingo hall and restroom buildings. As we discussed, I will break this into two quotes as you said the auction company has offered to pay for half of the pavilion building. In the pavilion building, we would be replacing all existing cameras and existing cable. We will need to pull a CAT5e cable to every camera. In addition to the existing cameras, we will be adding three cameras, with one in the main hall and two on the lower outside south east corner. We discussed moving the NVR to the main level into the closet behind the bar. All cameras will be 8MP and have a field-of view of 113-degrees. For the bingo hall, we discussed seven cameras. We will need a shelf in the NW corner of the kitchen to put the PoE switch on to plug the cameras into. We will use black wire and have to surface run if we cannot get through the shallow attic. All cameras will be 8MP and have a FOV of 113-degrees. In order to get the camera feed back to the NVR, we will need to install an outdoor wireless gigabit bridge with one antenna on the bingo hall and one on the pavilion. For the restroom building, we would be replacing the four existing cameras and add one new camera on the SW corner. A PoE switch will be installed in the closet space. We will need to install another outdoor wireless gigabit bridge with one antenna on the restroom building and one antenna on the bingo hall with a connection to the PoE switch in the bingo hall to get all the cameras back to the NVR.
