RESOLUTION NO. 2025-10

Adopting The Jefferson County Hazard Mitigation Plan 2025-2029

Executive Summary

The Federal Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 requires that government units periodically update their Hazard Mitigation Plans. Jefferson County initially adopted a multi-jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan in 2008 and updated the plan in 2012 and 2018. On September 10, 2024, the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors passed Resolution 2024-43 requiring the Emergency Management Department to update its plan. This new 2025 update will guide hazard mitigation efforts in Jefferson County for the next five-year period from 2025 through 2029.

The Jefferson County Hazard Mitigation Plan (2025-2029) identifies demographic and economic characteristics, climate, natural resources, land use, and developmental trends of the county. Special needs populations and groups are also identified. The plan inventories critical facilities in the County in light of natural hazards along with estimated losses to buildings and infrastructure. This plan makes clear appropriate solutions in terms of a wide range of activities that help to foster hazard mitigation efforts. Mitigation funding sources, maps, and other important features are included.

This resolution adopts the 2025-2029 Jefferson County Hazard Mitigation Plan. The Law Enforcement & Emergency Management Committee considered this resolution at its meeting on March 28, 2025, and recommended forwarding it to the County Board for approval.

WHEREAS, the Executive Summary is incorporated into this resolution, and

WHEREAS, the United States Congress passed the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 (DMA2K), which requires that a local unit of government must have an approved all hazard mitigation plan before it can receive Federal grant monies from the Federal Emergency Management Agency for pre-disaster mitigation projects, and

WHEREAS, Jefferson County Emergency Management has updated the comprehensive Hazard Mitigation Plan, initially adopted in 2008, that evaluates the risks posed by potential hazards including, but not limited to, flooding, tornadoes, winter storms, and other severe weather conditions, and identifies strategies for reducing the impact of such hazards on the community, and

WHEREAS, the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution No. 2024-43 on September 10, 2024, to accept public input concerning the updated plan, and

WHEREAS, Jefferson County has engaged relevant stakeholders, including local governments, emergency responders, community organizations, and the public, in the planning process to ensure the plan is comprehensive and reflects the needs of all residents, and

WHEREAS, the Jefferson County Hazard Mitigation Plan is designed to enhance the County's ability to protect its residents, infrastructure, and economy from the effects of disasters through proactive mitigation strategies, improved risk assessments, and coordinated response efforts, and

WHEREAS, the adoption of this plan demonstrates Jefferson County's commitment to mitigating hazards and improving the resilience of our communities, and

WHEREAS, the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors makes the following findings:

- 1. The Jefferson County Hazard Mitigation Plan, as prepared and presented by the Jefferson County Emergency Management Department, is hereby adopted as the official Hazard Mitigation Plan for Jefferson County.
- 2. The plan shall be used as a guide for future hazard mitigation efforts and will serve as the foundation for seeking and applying for federal, state, and local funding to implement mitigation projects.
- 3. The Jefferson County Emergency Management Director is hereby authorized to submit the adopted plan to FEMA and other relevant authorities for approval.
- 4. The Hazard Mitigation Plan shall be reviewed periodically and updated as necessary, with public input and participation from relevant stakeholders, to ensure its continued relevance and effectiveness.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Jefferson County hereby adopts the Jefferson County Natural Hazards Mitigation Plan: 2025-2029. While content related to Jefferson County may require revisions to meet the plan approval requirements, changes occurring after adoption will not require Jefferson County to re-adopt any further iterations of the plan. Subsequent plan updates following the approval period for this plan will require separate adoption resolutions.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT this resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

On Monday June 2nd, 2025 we had our monthly Operators training. Completed and finished all hose testing. We had LDH that needed to be completed from the hose room and Engine 67.

On Monday June 9th, 2025 we had our monthly EMS training. Training was with Medical Director Dr. George from Aurora Medical Center. Dr. George went over updated protocols and any questions with protocols. Reviewed trauma and traumatic arrest protocols. Reviewed past calls that we went on, discussed what went well and what could be improved on. Dr. George went through any questions the members wanted answers to.

On Monday June 16th, 2025 we had our monthly Fire training. Training was on extrication. We have had vehicles donated and some dropped off. Training was going over and practicing using the tools and what techniques we use to extricate the patient(s) smooth and quickly. We practiced car fires and how to best extinguish them and how to approach those vehicles.

On Monday June 30th, 2025 we had our monthly Combination training. Training was mass casualty vehicle crash. We had set up two stations with a three-vehicle crash. Each group had to triage the patients in the crash and come up with a plan on how to get patients extricated and transported by what they were triaged as.

WLOO CATV Monthly Manager's Report

for the month of June 2025

June was a month of several important changes for WLOO CATV.

Waterloo High School requested WLOO livestream the High School Commencement ceremonies on June 8th. There was no documentation about how to use the portable livestreaming equipment, and, although we were told it was functional it actually was not. Although she barely had two weeks notice, Jayden taught herself how to use the mobile livestreaming rig and repair it. The ceremony was successfully livestreamed and is also available on WLOO's YouTube channel.

Jayden and WHS' Cory Calvert worked well together and plan to collaborate over the summer so WHS and WLOO equipment matches and is compatible.

WLOO CATV Board member Chad Teubert resigned. Board member Kate Abitz took an indefinite leave of absence to attend to a personal matter. Since there would no longer be a quorum under these circumstances, the WLOO CATV Regulatory Board used its June 11th meeting to discuss and act on essential matters for station operation for the rest of 2025.

Board actions were as follows:

1) Board Chair Cotting recommended Jacob Niemuth (aka Jayden Sparks) for promotion to Station Director based on proven superior technical expertise and organizational skills. The Board interviewed Jayden in Closed Session. The Board approved the promotion, hours not to exceed an average of 12hours/week.

2) The 2026 Budget was reviewed and approved to be passed to the Finance, Insurance, and Personnel Committee. Total expenditures = \$47,624.20 with a projected surplus of \$1669.48.
3) The WLOO CATV Regulatory Board will not meet again until a date TBD in December 2025.

The day after the Board meeting, Jayden left for a vacation in Pennsylvania.

The Merriman Brothers Circus came to Waterloo on June 27th. WLOO CATV received permission from the Circus management to record its morning tour and set-up. Chris Weihert filmed the tour and created a piece, which can be viewed on WLOO CATV's YouTube Channel.

Teana Nightoak returned from a successful campground experience in Oregon and is ready to resume videography for WLOO.

§ 200-1. Fire Inspectors.

- A. Fire Chief to be Fire Inspector. The Fire Chief shall hold the office of Fire Inspector with power to appoint one or more Deputy Fire Inspectors, who shall perform the same duties and have the same powers as the Fire Inspector.
- B. Inspection duties. The Fire Inspectors shall inspect, semiannually, all public buildings and places of employment, as defined in § 101.01(11), Wis. Stats., within the City limits for the purpose of noting and causing to be corrected any conditions liable to cause fires. Repairs or alterations necessary to remove the hazardous condition shall be made within a reasonable time at the expense of the owner. The Inspector shall also investigate the storage and handling of explosives and inflammable liquids within the City.
- C. Procedure. Fire inspection procedures and forms shall be developed in accordance with § 101.14, Wis. Stats., and applicable codes of the National Fire Prevention Association.
- D. Written record of inspections. The Chief shall keep a written record card of each property inspected which shall conform to the requirements of the State Department of Commerce and shall make the semiannual report of inspections required by said Department.
- E. Correction of fire hazards. When any inspection by the Fire Chief or his deputies reveals a fire hazard, the Chief or his deputies may serve a notice, in writing, upon the owner of the property giving said owner a reasonable time in which to remove the hazard. If the fire hazard is not removed within the time allowed it shall be deemed a nuisance, and the Fire Chief or his deputy may have the same removed by the City, and the cost of such removal shall be recovered in an action by the City against the owner of the property and may also be entered on the tax roll as a special charge against the property.
- F. Entering on premises. No person shall deny the Fire Inspector or his deputies free access to any property within the City at any reasonable time for the purpose of making fire inspections. No person shall hinder or obstruct the Fire Inspector in the performance of his duty or refuse to observe any lawful direction given by him.

§ 200-2. Adoption of Administrative Code provisions.

§ 200-3. Accidental spills of hazardous substances.

See Chapter 215, Hazardous Substances, of this Code.

§ 200-4. Burning regulations. [Amended 7-11-2019 by Ord. No. 2019-06]

- A. Outdoor burning prohibited. No person shall cause, allow or permit outdoor burning of refuse, garbage, plant life, leaves or other combustible material within the City, except as permitted under Subsection C.
- B. Incinerators prohibited. It shall be unlawful for any person to operate and maintain or cause to be operated and maintained any incinerator within the City, except as permitted under Subsection C.
- C. Exceptions:
 - (1) Outdoor burning in connection with the preparation of food.
 - (2) The burning of refuse in a properly designed, operated and maintained incinerator, duly licensed by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources to be effective for the purpose of air pollution control, or outdoor burning by the City of Waterloo pursuant to a permit by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources.
 - (3) Small outdoor flames for welding, acetylene torches, safety flares, heating tar or similar applications.
 - (4) Any outdoor burning for which a person has obtained a permit from the Waterloo Fire Department.
 - (5) A fire set for the purpose of training public or private fire-fighting personnel.
 - (6) A fire set or required by a public officer for the abatement of nuisances and which is necessary in carrying out public health functions.
- D. Permit required. A one-time inspection for any new permanent installation of a fire pit (bricks and mortar, concrete, etc.) is required. [Amended 4-18-2024 by Ord. No. 2024-11]
- E. Responsibilities. The resident shall have the following responsibilities: [Amended 4-18-2024 by Ord. No. 2024-11]
 - (1) To adhere to all health and fire prevention codes.
 - (2) To have adult (18 years of age or older) supervisory personnel present at the site of the outdoor burning.
 - (3) To comply with the following conditions:
 - (a) Any fire deemed to be a public health nuisance by the Fire Chief or his or her designee shall be extinguished.

- (b) This shall apply to all manufactured burning rings, fireplaces, fire pits, chimneys or like devices.
- (c) No manufactured device shall be placed on any combustible surface.
- (d) The fire must be completely extinguished before the fire location may be left unsupervised.
- (e) The fire shall be no larger than four feet in diameter, subject to the exceptions listed below.
- (f) No flammable liquids shall be used to start or support the burning.
- (g) Only virgin wood and charcoal fuel will be allowed to be burned. "Virgin wood" means wood and other wood products, such as bark, but not to include sawdust, which have had no chemical treatments or finishes applied.
- (h) Under no circumstances shall plastics, trash, garbage, oils, hydrocarbon fuels, furniture, fabrics, leaves, yard waste, synthetic materials of any kind, pressure-treated wood or wood that has been finished with paints, varnishes, laminates or a similar finish be burned. Burn barrels are not allowed within the City limits.
- (i) The fire shall be located at least 10 feet from property lines and at least 20 feet from any building or structure. This does not apply to manufactured devices.
- (j) A functional extinguishing aid must be present, such as a fire extinguisher, garden hose, etc.
- (4) Exceptions. A bonfire exceeding the size restrictions set forth in Subsection E(3)(e) will be permitted for churches, organized schools, and civic organizations and only if application for site review has been made and approved by the Waterloo Fire Department. Such bonfire shall be no more than 10 feet in diameter or 10 feet by 10 feet square and no more than six feet high and must comply with all other provisions of the permit.
- F. Emergency provisions. Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, the Fire Chief, in times of extreme dryness or drought, deficiency in the water supply or by reason of any other emergency, is authorized to prohibit the setting of any fires upon any lands within the City by providing published notice of the declared emergency. Public notice will be made by City-wide call (Connect final site) as well as website and social media. [Amended 4-18-2024 by Ord. No. 2024-11]

§ 200-5. Fire prevention rapid entry requirement; Knox-Box systems. [Added 11-7-2019 by Ord. No. 2019-07¹]

A. Definition. The term "Knox-Box[®]" shall be defined as a lock box from the Knox Company which allows emergency responders to gain access to secured buildings and perimeters without forceful entry.

^{1.} Editor's Note: This ordinance also renumbered former § 200-5 as § 200-6.

- B. Buildings subject to this section.
 - (1) The following structures shall be equipped with a Knox-Box[®] at or near the main entrance or such other location approved by the Fire Chief or designee:
 - (a) Commercial or industrial structures protected by an automatic alarm system or automatic suppression system, or such structures that are secured in a manner that restricts access during an emergency.
 - (b) Multifamily residential structures with Four or more units that have restricted access through locked doors or have a common corridor for access to the living units.
 - (c) Governmental structures as required by the Fire Department.
 - (d) Nursing care facilities.
 - (e) All public and private educational facilities.
 - (2) All newly constructed structures subject to this section shall have the Knox-Box[®] installed and operational prior to the issuance of an occupancy permit.
- C. Buildings requiring a Knox-Box[®] shall be subject to numbering or lettering. All buildings over 5,000 square feet and with more than two doors must number or letter their doors (and windows when required by the Fire Chief or his/her designee). Numbering/Lettering must be no less than eight inches in size, reflective and a contrasting color to the door. Numbers/ Letters shall be placed on each door starting at the main entrance and progressing around the building clockwise. Numbers/Letters must be at least five feet above ground level. Where double doors or a grouping of doors exists close together, they may be numbered as one.
- D. Contents.
 - (1) The owner or operator of a structure required to have a Knox-Box[®] shall, at all times, keep keys in the box that will allow for access to the following:
 - (a) Keys to locked points of ingress or egress, whether on the interior or exterior of such buildings.
 - (b) Keys to locked mechanical rooms.
 - (c) Keys to elevator controls.
 - (d) Keys to rooms containing fire control systems.
 - (e) Keys to other areas as directed by the Fire Chief.
 - (2) Each key shall be legibly labeled to indicate the lock that it opens in such a manner as is approved by the Fire Chief or his/her designee.
 - (3) A floor plan of the rooms within the building may be required at the discretion of the Fire Chief or his/her designee.
- E. Compliance. After the effective date of this section, all newly constructed buildings, not yet

occupied, or buildings currently under construction and all buildings or businesses applying for an occupancy permit shall comply. Existing buildings that are not in compliance on the effective date of this section shall comply with requirements of this section within 16 months of this effective date of this section. Any person who owns or operates a structure subject to this section shall be subject to the penalties set forth in Subsection H of this section for any violation of this section.

- F. Rules and regulations. The Fire Chief or his/her designee shall be authorized to implement rules and regulations for the use of the lock box system.
- G. Brand. The "Knox" brand will be the only lock box permitted by the City of Waterloo.
- H. Penalties. Except as otherwise specifically provided in this chapter, any person who shall violate any provision of this section or any order, rule or regulation made hereunder shall be subject to a forfeiture as provided.
 - (1) First offense shall be a forfeiture of \$50 plus court costs and penalty assessments.
 - (2) Second offense shall be a forfeiture of \$100 plus court costs and penalty assessments.
 - (3) Third and subsequent offenses shall be a forfeiture of \$200 plus court costs and penalty assessment.

§ 200-6. Violations and penalties.

Any person who shall violate any provision of this chapter or any order, rule or regulation made hereunder shall be subject to a penalty as provided in Chapter 1, § 1-4 of this Code.

ORDINANCE #2025-09

An Ordinance Amending Section §200-1

RESOLUTION NO.2025-31

RESOLUTION DECLARING OFFICIAL INTENT TO REIMBURSE EXPENDITURES FROM PROCEEDS OF BORROWING

WHEREAS, the City of Waterloo, Jefferson County, Wisconsin (the "City") plans to undertake 2025-2027 electric system capital improvements (the "Project");

WHEREAS, the City expects to finance the Project on a long-term basis by issuing taxexempt bonds or other tax-exempt obligations (collectively, the "Bonds");

WHEREAS, because the Bonds will not be issued prior to commencement of the Project, the City must provide interim financing to cover costs of the Project incurred prior to receipt of the proceeds of the Bonds; and

WHEREAS, the Common Council (the "Governing Body") of the City deems it to be necessary, desirable, and in the best interest of the City to advance moneys from its funds on hand, or other sources, on an interim basis to pay the costs of the Project until the Bonds are issued.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing Body of the City that:

<u>Section 1. Expenditure of Funds</u>. The City shall make expenditures as needed to pay the cost of the Project until proceeds of the Bonds become available.

<u>Section 2. Declaration of Official Intent</u>. The City hereby officially declares its intent under Treas. Regs. Section 1.150-2 to reimburse said expenditures with proceeds of the Bonds, the principal amount of which is not expected to exceed \$2,221,000.

<u>Section 3. Unavailability of Long-Term Funds</u>. No funds for payment of the Project from sources other than the Bonds are, or are reasonably expected to be, reserved, allocated on a long-term basis, or otherwise set aside by the City pursuant to its budget or financial policies.

<u>Section 4. Public Availability of Official Intent Resolution</u>. This Resolution shall be made available for public inspection at the office of the City within 30 days after its approval in compliance with applicable State law governing the availability of records of official acts including Subchapter II of Chapter 19, and shall remain available for public inspection until the Bonds are issued.

<u>Section 5. Effective Date</u>. This Resolution shall be effective upon its adoption and approval.

Force Account -- Force Account is the work a municipality performs using its own employees and/or equipment. Documentation must be submitted verifying the personnel who did the work, hours worked, hourly wage and scope of work. For equipment, indicate the type of equipment and the work performed, the dates and hours of use, and the hourly cost. Enter amount to be reimbursed for personnel and equipment costs.

Interim Financing.-Interim financing is a debt to temporarily finance a project. Enter the amounts associated with the preparation, approval, issuance, and sale of interim financing (includes bond counsel, financial consultants, and underwriters fees).

Preliminary Design/Engineering--Enter contract costs for preliminary design/engineering services.

Land/Easements--Enter all amounts associated with the acquisition of land and easements for this project.

Engineering/Construction Mat.--Enter contract costs associated with engineering/construction management for this project.

Construction/Equipment--Enter costs associated with the contracted construction and equipment costs. Costs not included in a construction or equipment contract should be entered on the Miscellaneous line.

Miscellaneous Costs--Enter costs that are outside the scope of the engineering, construction and equipment contracts. These costs can include computers, start-up laboratory equipment, materials, supplies, bid advertising, etc. Construction-related items require prior review and approval by the regional Construction Management Engineer (CME) before seeking reimbursement. The municipality must provide the CME with a copy of the vendor's invoice. procurement method used and applicable bidding and contracting documentation. Once the CME has determined eligibility and given approval, the municipality may request reimbursement.

Closing Costs--Enter the eligible costs for closing purposes, which includes bond counsel and legal fees.

6. Other Funding Sources--(if applicable) Enter costs identified in the FAA as being paid by other sources, i.e., CDBG grant, municipal funds, Rural Development. These costs will not be reimbursed by the EIF.
