- CALL TO ORDER, PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE & ROLL CALL. Mayor Quimby called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Alderpersons present: Rhynes, Schoenwetter, Kuhl, Griffin, Thomas, Weihert and Petts. Absent none. Others attending remotely or in-person: Mark Herbst; Maureen Giese; Amber Gerber with the Courier; Library Director Kelli Mountford; Police Chief Denis Sorenson; Utility Superintendent Barry Sorenson; Fire Chief Wes Benisch; WLOO videographers; and Clerk/Treasurer Hansen. The pledge of allegiance was recited.



Friday July 9th, 2021

On Monday June 7th, 2021 we had our monthly Operators training. Operators worked on hydrant hood ups with maximum water. The operators have to connect the large diameter hose up to the truck while a firefighter is connecting it to the hydrant. Then they flow as much water as they can while watching the intake not to collapse a water main. The members have to watch the gauges and listen to the truck, if we would loss the water source firefighter lives and civilian lives would be in more danger.

On Monday June 14th, 2021 we had our monthly EMS training. Aurora Summit with our medical director came out to complete our required quarterlies. Every quarter we have to complete our critical skills with the medical director and Aurora staff. Things we have to cover is pit crew CPR, medications, airways and fluid replacement.

On Monday June 21st, 2021 we had our monthly Fire training. Training was on 2 min on scene drills and hydrofusion. The 2 min drills are where we have 6 on the engine, every member has the assigned duty. This is getting water, going in to fight the fire, going in to complete a search and rescue and getting ladders on the building if they are needed. The hydrofusions are a new tool for us. These are used to lift objects and stabilize at the same time.



RECITALS

WHEREAS, Subordinating Creditor is the City under a Tax Incremental Financing Developer's Performance Agreement dated June 24, 2013, as amended by an Addendum No. 1 dated December 31, 2014, as amended by an Addendum No. 2 dated December 10, 2018 (the "*Subordinated Agreement*"), in part securing up to \$800,000.00 in debt and certain interests in TIF Revenue proceeds, as provided in the Subordinated Agreement (including any Developer Revenue Obligation to Subordinated Agreement is Hawthorn & Stone Construction, Inc., a Wisconsin corporation (the "*Debtor*"). The Subordinated Agreement encumbers the following described property (the "*Property*"), to wit:

See Exhibit A attached hereto and made part hereof.

WHEREAS, the Lender is making a loan to Debtor under the terms and conditions of a [term loan agreement] (the "*Credit Agreement*") in the principal amount not to exceed \$702,000.00 (the "*Senior Debt*") which is secured by a certain Mortgage in favor of Lender (collectively, the "*Lender's Mortgage*") encumbering the Property.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 10.6 of the Subordinated Agreement, the Subordinating Creditor agreed to subordinate its interest in the Secured Subordinated Debt to any mortgage lien of a commercial mortgage lender on the Property.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the recitals and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, Subordinating Creditor hereby agrees with the Lender as follows:

1. Regardless of any priority otherwise available to the Subordinating Creditor, the lien of the Subordinated Agreement in the Property is and shall be and shall remain fully subordinated for all purposes to the lien of the Lender's Mortgage, to the full extent of all sums from time to time secured by the Lender's Mortgage, and interest and fees and costs as provided under the Lender's Mortgage, from time to time in accordance with the terms of the Lender's Mortgage. It is specifically understood and acknowledged by Lender, Subordinating Creditor and Debtor that the intent of this Agreement is to subordinate the interest of the Subordinating Creditor under the Subordinated Agreement to debt secured by the Lender's Mortgage. The Subordinated Creditor's agreement to subordinate the lien of the Subordinated Agreement to the Lender's Mortgage provided by this Section 1 shall be in effect regardless of whether it is determined by a court of competent jurisdiction that the Lender's Mortgage are unenforceable. Subordinated Creditor affirms and agrees that it no longer has the ability to record a mortgage as previously set forth in Sections 4.1 and 10.10(b) of the Subordinated Agreement.

2. The Lender shall have no obligation whatsoever to Subordinating Creditor with respect to the transaction evidenced by the Lender's Mortgage, and the Lender may make and administer the loan secured by the Lender's Mortgage in any manner it sees fit and may from time to time extend, modify, suspend, revoke, rescind, change, or terminate provisions of the Lender's Mortgage, the Credit Agreement secured thereby or any other documents issued to the Lender in connection therewith or pursuant thereto, doing so without notice to or consent by the Subordinating Creditor and without affecting or impairing in any fashion the terms of this Agreement. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Lender may not increase the Senior Debt amount secured by the Lender's Mortgage without the written consent of the Subordinating Creditor, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld. If the Subordinating Creditor consents to an increase in the Senior Debt amount, a new subordination agreement shall be executed by the Parties.

3. Subordinating Creditor's right, title and interest in the Property as against any person other than Lender is expressly reserved and not affected by this Agreement. The Subordinating Creditor shall be entitled to enforce all claims of the Subordinating Creditor against Debtor as a general creditor, and Lender's claims against Debtor as a general creditor shall have no priority, by virtue of this Agreement, over such claims of the Subordinating Creditor. Subordinating Creditor agrees that it may not exercise any rights or remedies pursuant to an event of default under the Subordinated Agreement without providing Lender written notice of such default and the opportunity to cure such default on behalf of Debtor pursuant to Article VIII of the Subordinated Agreement. Lender acknowledges receipt of copies of the Subordinated Agreement and related documents which confirm the terms of payment to Subordinating Creditor of the amounts secured by the Subordinated Agreement.

4. Upon the happening of any Event of Default (as that term is defined in the Lender's Mortgage), no payment or distribution of assets shall be made by the Debtor on the Secured Subordinated Debt or accepted by the Subordinating Creditor on account of the Secured Subordinated Debt, unless and until the earliest of the date on which: (a) such Event of Default shall have been cured to the satisfaction of the Lender or waived by the Lender, or shall have ceased to exist; (b) any acceleration of the Senior Debt shall have been rescinded or annulled; (c) the Senior Debt shall have been paid in full in cash or other property satisfactory to the Senior Creditor; or (d) the benefit of this Section is expressly waived in writing by the Lender. The Lender shall provide written notice to the Subordinating Creditor of any Event of Default.

5. Subordinating Creditor hereby waives any ability to enforce its rights against the Debtor pursuant to the Employment Plan under Sections 4.1(h), 5.2(d), 6.4, or Exhibit F of the Subordinated Agreement, and further agrees that the Debtor shall be under no obligation to continue the Employment Plan, as defined in the Subordinated Agreement.

6. Neither Subordinating Creditor nor the Lender (i) makes any representation or warranty concerning the Property or any other property of the Debtor or the validity, perfection or (except as to the subordination accomplished hereby) priority of any mortgage lien thereon or security interest therein, or (ii) shall have any duty to preserve, protect, care for, insure, take possession of, collect, dispose of, or otherwise realize upon the Property or any other property of the Debtor.

7. This Agreement is made under the laws of the State of Wisconsin. This Agreement cannot be waived or changed, except by a writing signed by the party to be bound thereby. This Agreement is made between the Lender and Subordinating Creditor, and shall inure to the benefit of, and shall be enforceable by, the Lender and Subordinating Creditor and their respective successors and assigns. Neither the Debtor nor any other person (except the Lender, its successors and assigns), shall be entitled to rely on, have the benefit of or enforce this Agreement.

8. In the event either Party brings an action or proceeding to enforce this Agreement, the prevailing Party in such action proceeding shall be entitled to recover from the other all costs incurred in connection therewith, including reasonable attorney's fees.

9. Each Party signing this Agreement has been duly authorized to sign on behalf of such respective Party.

10. This Agreement shall be amended only in the form of a subsequent writing signed by the Parties.

COLLATERAL ASSIGNMENT OF TIF PAYMENT RIGHTS AND PROVISIONS OF THE DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT RELATED THERETO

THIS COLLATERAL ASSIGNMENT OF TIF PAYMENT RIGHTS AND PROVISIONS OF THE DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT RELATED THERETO (this "Assignment") is made as of July [__], 2021, by **RIVERWALK OF WATERLOO**, LLC, a Wisconsin limited liability company ("Riverwalk"), and **HAWTHORN & STONE CONSTRUCTION**, **INC.**, a Wisconsin corporation ("Hawthorn") (together, Riverwalk and Hawthorn are collectively referred to as the "Borrower"), in favor of **NORTHWEST BANK & TRUST COMPANY**, an Iowa corporation ("Lender").

RECITALS

A. Pursuant to the terms of that certain Business Loan Agreement between Borrower and Lender of even date herewith (as may be amended, modified, supplemented restated or replaced from time to time, the "Loan Agreement"), Lender has agreed to make a loan to Borrower in the original principal amount of up to Six Hundred Twenty-Four Thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$624,000) (the "Loan") evidenced by that certain Promissory Note, dated as of the date of the Agreement, executed by Borrower in favor of Lender in the original principal amount of the Loan (as may be amended, modified, supplemented restated or replaced from time to time, the "Note").

B. Borrower is the owner of the real property and improvements thereon and improvements in the course of construction thereon, described on the attached <u>Exhibit A</u> (the "Property"). Borrower proposes to construct a multifamily housing project on the Property.

C. In connection with the development of the Property, Borrower and the City of Waterloo (the "City") have entered into a Tax Increment Financing Developer's Performance Agreement, dated as of June 24, 2013, as amended by that certain Addendum No. 1 to Tax Incremental Financing Developer's Performance Agreement ("Addendum No. 1") and Addendum No. 2 to Tax Incremental Financing Developer's Performance Agreement ("Addendum No. 1") ("Addendum No. 2") (collectively, the "Development Agreement").

D. Pursuant to Section 7.3 of the Development Agreement, the City has committed to reimburse Hawthorn for certain Developer Subsidy or Developer Revenue Obligation payments made by Hawthorn to City based on TIF Revenue generated, payable in annual installments, in an aggregate amount not to exceed \$1,182,362 (the "TIF Payments"), in accordance with the Developer Revenue Obligation set forth by the City for the benefit of Hawthorn.

E. Lender requires Borrower to execute and deliver this Assignment as collateral for the Loan, and to secure the Consent of City and Estoppel, which is attached hereto as <u>Exhibit B</u>.

F. Lender would not make the Loan to Borrower unless the City provides the attached Consent of City and Estoppel.

AGREEMENTS

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and of the mutual promises contained herein, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged by Borrower, Borrower hereby agrees as follows:

Assignment. In order to secure the payment and performance of all debts, 1. liabilities and obligations (together, "Obligations") of the Borrower to the Lender under Note, the Loan Agreement, and all other documents evidencing or securing the Loan (collectively the "Loan Documents"), the Borrower hereby assigns to Lender, and grants to Lender a continuing first priority security interest in, all now or hereafter existing rights, title, and interest of the Borrower in and to the TIF Payments, and all of Borrower's rights under the Development Agreement related to the TIF Payments, including all of Borrower's rights to receive the TIF Payments thereunder, and all rights of the Borrower to enforce the City's obligations to make the TIF Payments, and, if the City issues a Municipal Revenue Obligation, or similar document evidencing the City's obligations to make the TIF Payments ("MRO"), all rights under such an MRO are also assigned herein. The "Development Agreement" shall mean the Tax Increment Financing Developer's Agreement, between the Borrower and the City of Waterloo, Wisconsin ("City"), dated as of June 24, 2013. The "TIF Payments" shall mean the payments from City to Borrower, to be made under Section 7.3 of the Development Agreement, which the City has committed to provide as a Developer Subsidy or Developer Revenue Obligation to Borrower, payable to Borrower in annual installments, in an aggregate amount not to exceed \$1,182,362, without any reduction or set off of amounts for any purpose, including for a default by Borrower under the Development Agreement, or any other charge or obligation or remedy under the Development Agreement. The "Loan Documents" shall mean the Note and all other documents executed in connection therewith. This is intended to be an present assignment of all such rights to Lender, it being understood and agreed that, if and when the Obligations are satisfied in full, then Lender shall execute a termination of this Assignment, and return any MRO, if issued.

1. <u>Remittance of TIF Payments Directly to Lender</u>. Borrower has executed the Assignment and Direction for Direct Payment, which is attached hereto as <u>Exhibit C</u>, directing that all the TIF Payments payable by the City, shall be paid by the City directly to Lender, for application to the outstanding Obligations on the Loan, until the full repayment of all Obligations under the Loan. Borrower covenants and agrees to take any and all actions requested by the Lender or the City to facilitate direct payment of such amounts by the City to Lender. In the event Borrower shall receive any TIF Payments directly, Borrower shall immediately remit such payment to Lender, provided that the Obligations remain outstanding at the time of such TIF Payment.

2. <u>Performance of Borrower</u>. Borrower shall faithfully abide by, perform and discharge each of Borrower's obligations, covenants and agreements under the Development Agreement, so as to assure the continued payment by the City of the TIF Payments, and shall pay all real estate and personal property taxes on the Property when they are due. Without the prior written consent of Lender, Borrower shall not (a) modify or in any way alter the terms of the Development Agreement, (b) pledge or assign the Development Agreement or the TIF Payments, (c) waive any of its rights under the Development Agreement, (d) terminate or surrender the Development Agreement, (e) make an application for any part of the Property to be exempt from real estate taxes, or allow any user of the Property to do so; (f) file a claim or appeal or in any other way attempt to lower the real estate tax assessment on the Property; or (g) sell any portion

of the Property without Lender's prior written consent. Borrower shall notify Lender each time any of the tax parcel numbers for the Property is changed or divided.

3. <u>Protect Security</u>. At Borrower's sole cost and expense, Borrower shall appear and defend any action or proceeding arising under, during, out of or in any manner connected with the Development Agreement or the obligations, duties or liabilities of Borrower under the Development Agreement, and shall pay any reasonable costs and expense of Lender, including reasonable attorneys' fees, in any such action or proceeding in which Lender decides, in its sole discretion, to appear.

4. Representations and Covenants. Borrower represents and warrants that (a) Borrower or its affiliates is the fee simple owner of the Property and that the tax parcel numbers on Exhibit A are the current correct tax parcel numbers; (b) Borrower has the full right to assign the TIF Payments and the Development Agreement as it relates to the TIF Payments (subject to the City's consent attached hereto); (c) the Development Agreement is valid, is in full force and effect, is binding on the City and Borrower, and has not been modified or amended, nor have any new development or other agreements been entered into between Borrower and City which would impact the Development Agreement; (d) Lender shall have a first priority lien and security interest in and to the TIF Payments and to the rights under the Development Agreement related to the TIF Payments, there are no outstanding assignments or pledges of the TIF Payments or the Development Agreement provisions related thereto, and Borrower shall not make any further assignments or pledges of the TIF Payments or the provisions of the Development Agreement related thereto, until all Obligations under the Loan are paid in full; and (e) there are no existing defaults, rights of setoff, or claims for additional payments under the Development Agreement.

5. <u>Authorization</u>. Upon an Event of Default under any of the Loan Documents, Borrower irrevocably constitutes and appoints Lender its true and lawful attorney-in-fact in Borrower's name or in Lender's name, or otherwise, to enforce all rights of Borrower under the Development Agreement as they relate to the TIF Payments, and such power, being coupled with an interest, is irrevocable.

6. <u>Borrower Holds Lender Harmless</u>. Borrower shall indemnify and hold Lender harmless of and from (a) any and all liability, loss or damage which it incurs under the Development Agreement or by reason of this Assignment; and (b) any and all claims and demands which are asserted against it by reason of any alleged obligations or undertakings on its part to perform or discharge any of the terms, covenants or agreements contained in the Development Agreement. The amount of all such liabilities, losses, damages, claims and demands, and the cost of defending against them, including costs, expenses and reasonable attorneys' fees, are secured by this Assignment and constitute part of the Obligations. Borrower shall reimburse Lender for such amounts immediately upon demand.

7. <u>Security Interest in Agreements</u>. In addition, Borrower hereby grants to Lender a security interest in Borrower's right, title, and interest in the TIF Payments and the provisions of the Development Agreement related thereto, if and to the extent that a security interest may be granted therein under the Wisconsin Uniform Commercial Code, and Borrower acknowledges that Lender shall have all of the rights and remedies with respect thereto provided for by the

Wisconsin Uniform Commercial Code, in addition to the other rights and remedies herein granted to Lender, in the event of the occurrence of an Event of Default.

8. <u>Successors and Assigns</u>. This Assignment shall be binding upon Borrower and its successors and assigns, and shall inure to the benefit of Lender, its successors and assigns. Borrower shall not further assign its obligations or interests under the TIF Payments or the provisions of the Development Agreement related thereto, or under this Assignment, or further encumber those interests, without Lender's prior written consent. Further, Borrower shall not sell or transfer the ownership of any part of the Property to another person or entity without Lender's prior written consent, which may be withheld or conditioned upon such purchaser or assignee also making the covenants herein directly to Lender and signing a payment in lieu of taxes or similar agreement to insure the continued payment of the TIF Payments.

9. <u>Governing Law</u>. This Assignment shall be governed by the laws of the State of Wisconsin.

10. <u>Validity Clause</u>. This Assignment shall confer to Lender the rights and benefits described in this Assignment to the full extent allowable by law. The unenforceability or invalidity of any of the provisions of this Assignment shall not render any other provision or provisions unenforceable or invalid. Any provision found to be unenforceable shall be severable from this Assignment without invalidating the remainder of such provision or the remaining provisions of this Assignment.

11. <u>Notices and Approvals</u>. Any notice that either party may desire or may be required to give to any other party shall be in writing and shall be delivered as required under the Loan Documents.

12. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Assignment may be signed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original and all of which together shall constitute one instrument.

13. <u>City Consent</u>. Lender shall not make the Loan until the City executes and delivers to Lender the Consent and Estoppel attached hereto as Exhibit C.

14. <u>Shortfall Payment Provisions</u>. Borrower acknowledges that the Loan Agreement contains terms which can limit the Loan amount to less than the amount stated above, and provisions for "Shortfall Payments" if the income stream of TIF Payments is less than, or is reasonably anticipated to be less than, the anticipated TIF Payments shown on the Schedules to the Loan Agreement.

15. <u>Lender's Rights Upon Default</u>. If a default occurs under the Loan Documents beyond any applicable notice and cure period (an "Event of Default"), then Lender may at its option upon written notice to Borrower and the City, but without any obligation to do so, elect to assume Borrower's rights to receive TIF Payments under the Development Agreement, and rights to enforce the payment of the TIF Payment. Prior to any affirmative assumption of Borrower's obligations under the Development Agreement, nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as an assumption by Lender of any liability or obligation of Borrower under the Development Agreement. Lender shall not be obligated to perform or discharge and does not by

this Assignment undertake to perform or discharge any obligation, duty or liability under the Development Agreement.

THIS CONSENT OF CITY AND ESTOPPEL is made by the City of Waterloo, Wisconsin (the "City") for the benefit of Northwest Bank & Trust Company ("Lender") with respect to that certain Tax Incremental Financing Developer's Performance Agreement, dated as of June 24, 2013, between the City and Hawthorn & Stone, Inc., a Wisconsin corporation ("Borrower") (the "Development Agreement"), in consideration of the Lender making the Loan (defined below), which is necessary for the funding of the development identified in the Development Agreement.

1. <u>Borrower Assignment</u>. City acknowledges that it has received the Direction of Borrower of assignment to Lender, of all rights to the TIF Payments defined below, and the provisions of the Development Agreement related thereto ("Assignment"), in connection with a Loan between Borrower and Lender in the principal amount of up to Six Hundred Twenty-Four Thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$624,000) ("Loan", which is represented by certain "Loan Documents" by and between Borrower and Lender).

16. <u>Payment Direction</u>. City agrees to make all reimbursements of Developer Subsidy or Developer Revenue Obligation payments due to Borrower pursuant to Section 7.3 of the Development Agreement (the "TIF Payments") directly to Lender at the following address: Northwest Bank & Trust Company, 100 E, Kimberly Road, Davenport, Iowa, 52806, Attn: Emily Blaylock, until Lender notifies the City that all Obligations under the Loan have been paid in full and the Assignment is terminated. City shall have no responsibility to independently verify anything regarding the Loan and shall be entitled to rely on this Assignment until it receives this Lender notice that the Assignment has been terminated. City agrees to issue a separate Municipal Revenue Obligation to evidence the TIF Payments.

17. <u>Consent to Assignment</u>. The City hereby consents to the foregoing Assignment, agrees to make the TIF Payments directly to Lender at the address stated above, and agrees that the City shall continue to perform its obligations under the terms of the Development Agreement, to the extent they relate to the TIF Payments, in the manner specified in the Development Agreement as if Lender were the recipient of the TIF Payments. As identified in the Development Agreement, to the extent the City creates a PILOT Agreement or Municipal Revenue Obligation, all income from the PILOT Agreement or Municipal Revenue Obligation shall be considered in lieu of taxes and therefore be counted as part of the TIF Payments.

18. <u>No Release</u>. Nothing in the foregoing Assignment constitutes a release by the City of Borrower from its obligations under the Development Agreement. Borrower remains responsible to the City for all of its obligations under the Development Agreement.

19. <u>Notice and Cure Rights</u>. The City shall provide Lender with copies of any notices given to Borrower under the Development Agreement, whether or not they related to the TIF Payments, and any notices of default thereunder, in the same manner and at the same time as required under the Development Agreement to be given to Borrower, including for notices for

any party initiating or threatening a formal process (collectively, "Challenges"), the result of which would result in reducing any payment under the Development Agreement, including, but not limited to: (a) attempts to lower the assessed valuation of the Property, (b) seeking property tax exemption status for the Property, or (c) invalidating a PILOT or guaranteed minimum tax payment or the TIF Payments. City expressly acknowledges and agrees Lender is an intended third party beneficiary for purposes of this Consent and for the rights to the TIF Payments under the Assignment, Loan, and Loan Documents. City further agrees to vigorously resist and defend any Challenges. Notices to Lender shall be made to the address set forth above, or such other address as is provided by Lender from time to time. City agrees that Lender shall have the right, but not the obligation, to cure any default by Borrower under the TIF Payments, and provisions of the Development Agreement related thereto, and City agrees to accept any cure of such a default under the Development Agreement by Lender as if such cure were tendered or performed by Borrower. Notices to Lender shall be provided in writing and deemed given upon personal delivery, or when sent by U.S. mail, certified or registered, postage prepaid, return receipt requested, by overnight courier service such as Federal Express with tracking information, or other overnight mail with tracking information, and addressed to:

20. Estoppel. City understands that Lender's Loan is an integral part of the financing for the development identified in the Development Agreement, and making the Loan provides sufficient consideration to City for the representations and obligations contained herein. City represents and warrants to Lender that, in consideration of Lender providing financing to the project described in the Development Agreement, as of the date hereof: (i) the Development Agreement is and remains in full force and effect and has not been amended or modified, nor has any other agreement been entered into between the City and Borrower, or any affiliate of Borrower, that would affect the TIF Payments and the provisions of the Development Agreement related thereto; (ii) no default currently exists under the Development Agreement and no condition exists which, with the passage of time, would constitute a default under the Development Agreement; (iii) Borrower has not previously assigned the TIF Payments, or the provisions of the Development Agreement related thereto; (iv) other than the failure of Borrower to complete construction of the improvements on the Property, and to pay the real estate taxes on the Property, no default under the Development Agreement may hinder, delay, have superiority over, or prevent the payment of the TIF Payments to Borrower, in the manner identified in the Development Agreement [or on the attached Schedule]; (v) City warrants that the TIF Payments as identified in Exhibit B to Addendum No. 2 (the "Total TIF Increment"), have first priority for payment from the tax increment generated from the Property, and no other person or entity is entitled to payment from the taxes paid for the Property, other than for any TIF Revenue deficiency to cover a Shortfall, as described in Section 7.3(c) of the Development Agreement; (vi) in consideration of Lender lending money to the project to facilitate further development, City covenants with Lender not to modify or amend the Development Agreement in a manner which would affect the TIF Payments, without Lender's prior consent; and (vii) City represents that Borrower has satisfied, to the City's satisfaction, the following Sections of the Development Agreement as of the date hereof and is not in default: Sections 3.1(a), 3.1(d), 3.2(b), 4.1(a), 4.1(b), 4.1(c), and 4.1(d).

21. <u>Waiver of Setoff</u>. City specifically waives any and all rights of setoff against Borrower as it pertains to the TIF payments due to Lender under the Assignment, Loan, or Loan Documents.

22. <u>Payment of Real Estate Taxes and Special Assessments</u>. City acknowledges and agrees that the payment of Real Estate Taxes and Special Assessments shall be the responsibility of Borrower, but Lender reserves the right to directly pay on Borrower's behalf such taxes and assessments in whole or in part, where if Borrower or Lender make partial payments, City will continue to make the TIF Payments pro-rata (whether to Borrower or Lender, as directed under the Assignment) in accordance with such partial payments.

23. <u>No Waiver; Cumulative Remedies</u>. No act, delay, or omission of Lender, or its designated agent, shall be deemed to be a waiver of any rights granted hereunder, and no waiver shall be valid unless in writing, signed by Lender, and then only to the extent therein set forth. A waiver of any right or remedy hereunder on anyone occasion shall not be construed as a bar to any right or remedy which Lender would otherwise have on any future occasion. No failure to exercise, nor any delay in exercising, on the part of Lender, or its designated agent, with respect to any right, power, or privilege hereunder shall operate as a waiver thereof; nor shall any single or partial exercise of any right, power, or privilege herein provided are cumulative and may be exercised singly or concurrently, and are not exclusive of any rights or remedies provided by law

24. <u>No Amendment</u>. City agrees that it shall not, without the prior written consent of the Lender, amend or modify or consent to any modification or amendment of the Development Agreement or the separate Subordination Agreement executed by the City. Lender may assign Lender's rights and obligations in whole or in part under the Assignment, Loan, and Loan Documents without consent of the City, provided Lender will provide notice to City of such assignment.

ORDINANCE #2021-06 Amending Chapter 340 Article IV UTILITIES Relating To Wireless Communications Facilities in the Right-of-Way

The City Council of the City of Waterloo, Jefferson County, Wisconsin do ordain as follows:

SECTION A: Chapter 340 <u>Article IV Communications Utility</u> is hereby amended as shown below incorporating the text presented here enumerating it after the exiting sections 340-27 to 340-29.

Article IV Communications Utility

Section 1: Definitions

For the purposes of this Chapter, the terms below shall have the following meanings: "Administrator" means the Waterloo Water & Light Commission Utilities Utility Manager or his or her designee.

"Application" means a formal request, including all required and requested documentation and information, submitted by an applicant to the City of Waterloo for a wireless permit.

"Applicant" means a person or entity filing an application for a wireless permit under this Chapter.

"**Base Station**," consistent with 47 C.F.R. § 1.6100(b)(1), means a structure or wireless equipment at a fixed location that enables FCC-licensed or authorized wireless communications between user equipment and a communications network. This definition does not include towers or any equipment associated with a tower.

"City," means the City of Waterloo, Wisconsin.

"Eligible Facilities Request," consistent with 47 C.F.R. § 1.6100(b)(3), means any request for modification of an existing tower or base station that does not substantially change the physical dimensions of such tower or base station, involving: (i) collocation of new transmission equipment; (ii) removal of transmission equipment; or (iii) replacement of transmission equipment.

"FCC" means the Federal Communications Commission.

"Governmental Pole," consistent with Wis. Stat. § 66.0414(1)(n), means a utility pole that is owned or operated by the City of Waterloo in the right-of-way.

"Historic District," consistent with Wis. Stat. § 66.0414(3)(c)5, means an area designated as historic by the City of Waterloo, listed on the national register of historic places in Wisconsin, or listed on the state register of historic places.

"**Right-of-Way**" means the surface of, and the space above and below the entire width of an improved https://waterloowi.sharepoint.com/sites/Fileshares/data/Common/ORDINANCES/2021 ORDINANCES/2_PROPOSED/2021-06 5G/2021-06 Amending Article IV Wireless Facilities.docx 7/13/2021 7:07 PM or unimproved public roadway, highway, street, bicycle lane, landscape terrace, shoulder, side slope, public sidewalk, or public utility easement over which the City of Waterloo exercises any rights of management and control or in which the City of Waterloo has an interest.

"Small Wireless Facility," consistent with 47 C.F.R. § 1.6002(I), means a facility that meets each of the following conditions:

(1) The structure on which antenna facilities are mounted, measured from ground level:i. is 50 feet or less in height, or

ii. is no more than 10 percent taller than other adjacent structures, or

iii. is not extended to a height of more than 50 feet or by more than 10 percent above its preexisting height, whichever is greater, as a result of the collocation of new antenna facilities;

(2) Each antenna (excluding associated antenna equipment) is no more than three cubic feet in volume;

(3) All other wireless equipment associated with the structure, including the wireless equipment associated with the antenna and any pre-existing associated equipment on the structure, is cumulatively no more than 28 cubic feet in volume;

(4) The facility does not require antenna structure registration under 47 C.F.R. part 17;

(5) The facility is not located on Tribal land as defined in 36 C.F.R. § 800.16(x); and

(6) The facility does not result in human exposure to radiofrequency radiation in excess of the applicable safety standards specified by federal law.

"**Support Structure**" means any structure in the right-of-way (other than an electric transmission structure) capable of supporting wireless equipment, including a utility pole, a wireless support structure as defined in Wis. Stat. § 66.0414(1)(zp), or a base station.

"Tower," consistent with 47 C.F.R. § 1.6100(b)(9), means any structure built for the sole or primary purpose of supporting any Federal Communication Commission (FCC) licensed or authorized antennas and their associated facilities, including structures that are constructed for wireless communications services including, but not limited to, private, broadcast, and public safety services, as well as unlicensed wireless services and fixed wireless services such as microwave backhaul, and the associated site. This definition does not include utility poles.

"Transmission Equipment," consistent with 47 C.F.R. § 1.6100(b)(9), means equipment that facilitates transmission for any FCC-licensed or authorized wireless communication service, including, but not limited to, radio transceivers, antennas, coaxial or fiber-optic cable, and regular and backup power supply. The term includes equipment associated with wireless communications services including, but not limited to, private, broadcast, and public safety services, as well as unlicensed wireless services and fixed wireless services such as microwave backhaul.

"**Underground District**," consistent with Wis. Stat. § 66.0414(3)(c)5, means an area designated by the City of Waterloo in which all pipes, pipelines, ducts, wires, lines, conduits, or other equipment, which are used for the transmission, distribution, or delivery of electrical power, heat, water, gas, sewer, or telecommunications equipment, are to be located underground.

"Utility Pole," means a pole that is used in whole or in part by a communications service provider; used for electric distribution, lighting, traffic control, signage, or a similar function; or used for the collocation of small wireless facilities. "Utility pole" does not include a wireless support structure or an electric transmission structure.

"Utility Pole for Designated Services" means a utility pole owned or operated in a right-of-way by the City of Waterloo that is designed to, or used to, carry electric distribution lines, or cables or wires for telecommunications, cable, or electric service.

"Wireless Equipment" means an antenna facility at a fixed location that enables wireless services between user equipment and a communications network, and includes all of the following: (a) equipment associated with wireless services; (b) radio transceivers, antennas, or coaxial, metallic, or fiber-optic cable located on, in, under, or otherwise adjacent to a support structure; (c) regular and backup power supplies; (d) equipment that is comparable to equipment specified in this definition regardless of technical configuration. "Wireless Equipment" does not include (a) the structure or improvements on, under, or within which the equipment is collocated; (b) wireline backhaul facilities; or (c) coaxial, metallic, or fiber-optic cable that is between utility poles or wireless support structures or that is not adjacent to a particular antenna. The definition of "Wireless Equipment" in this ordinance is consistent with the definition of "wireless facility" in Wis. Stat. § 66.0414(1)(z).

"Wireless Facility" or "Facility" means an installation at a fixed location in the right-of-way consisting of wireless equipment and the support structure, if any, associated with the wireless equipment.

"Wireless Infrastructure Provider" means any person or entity, other than a wireless services provider, that builds or installs wireless communications transmission equipment, antenna equipment, or wireless support structures.

"Wireless Permit" or "Permit" means a permit issued pursuant to this Chapter and authorizing the placement or modification of a wireless facility of a design specified in the permit at a particular location within the right-of-way, and the modification of any existing support structure to which the wireless facility is proposed to be attached.

"Wireless Provider" means a wireless infrastructure provider or a wireless services provider.

"Wireless Regulations" means those regulations adopted pursuant to Section 5(b)(1) to implement the provisions of this Chapter.

"Wireless Services" means any service using licensed or unlicensed wireless spectrum, including the use of a Wi-Fi network, whether at a fixed location or by means of a mobile device.

"Wireless Service Provider" means a person or entity that provides wireless services.

Definitions in this Section may contain quotations or citations to 47 C.F.R. §§ 1.6100 and 1.6002 and Wis. Stat. § 66.0414. In the event that any referenced section is amended, creating a conflict between the definition as set forth in this Chapter and the amended language of the referenced section, the definition in the referenced section, as amended, shall control. City of Waterloo

Section 2: Purpose

In the exercise of its police powers, the City of Waterloo has priority over all other uses of the right-ofway. The purpose of this Chapter is to provide the City of Waterloo with a process for managing, and uniform standards for acting upon, requests for the placement of wireless facilities within the right-ofhttps://waterloowi.sharepoint.com/sites/Fileshares/data/Common/ORDINANCES/2021 ORDINANCES/2_PROPOSED/2021-06 5G/2021-06 Amending Article IV Wireless Facilities.docx 7/13/2021 7:07 PM way consistent with the City of Waterloo obligation to promote the public health, safety, and welfare; to manage the right-of-way; and to ensure that the public's use is not obstructed or incommoded by the use of the right-of-way for the placement of wireless facilities. The City of Waterloo recognizes the importance of wireless facilities to provide high-quality communications and internet access services to residents and businesses within the City of Waterloo. The City of Waterloo also recognizes its obligation to comply with applicable Federal and State laws regarding the placement of wireless facilities in the right-of-way including, without limitation, the Telecommunications Act of 1996 (47 U.S.C. § 151 et seq.), Section 6409(a) of the Middle Class Tax Relief and Job Creation Act of 2012, Wis. Stat. § 182.017, Wis. Stat. § 196.58, and Wis. Stat. § 66.0414, as amended, and this Chapter shall be interpreted consistent with those provisions.

Section 3: Scope

(a) **Applicability**. Unless exempted by Section 3(b), below, every person who wishes to place a wireless facility in the right-of-way or modify an existing wireless facility in the right-of-way must obtain a wireless permit under this Chapter.

(b) **Exempt Facilities**. The provisions of this Chapter (other than Sections 10-13) shall not be applied to applications for the following:

(1) Installation, maintenance, operation, or replacement of a small wireless facility strung on cables between two existing utility poles in compliance with the National Electrical Safety Code, provided that the small wireless facility does not exceed 24 inches in length, 15 inches in width, and 12 inches in height and has no exterior antenna longer than 11 inches.

(2) Installation of a mobile cell facility (commonly referred to as "cell on wheels" or "cell on truck") for a temporary period in connection with an emergency or event, but no longer than required for the emergency or event, provided that installation does not involve excavation, movement, or removal of existing facilities.

(3) Placement or modification of a wireless facility by City of Waterloo staff or any person performing work under contract with the City of Waterloo.

(4) The replacement of an existing small wireless facility with a small wireless facility that is substantially similar to, or the same size or smaller than, the existing small wireless facility, provided that there is no change to the support structure on which the small wireless facility is placed.

(5) Routine maintenance of a wireless facility.

(c) **Placement on City of Waterloo-Owned or –Controlled Support Structures**. Any applicant who wishes to place wireless equipment on a support structure owned or controlled by the City of Waterloo, including governmental poles and utility poles for designated services, must obtain a wireless permit under this Chapter and enter into an attachment agreement with the Waterloo Water & Light Commission . The agreement shall include provisions regarding make-ready work and specify the compensation to be paid to the City of Waterloo for use of the support structure in accordance with the standards set out in Wis. Stat. § 66.0414(4), as amended. Unless prohibited by state or federal law, the person or entity seeking the agreement shall reimburse the City of Waterloo for all costs the City of Waterloo incurs in connection with its review of and action upon the request for an agreement.

Section 4: Nondiscrimination

In establishing the rights, obligations, and conditions set forth in this Chapter, it is the intent of the City of Waterloo to treat each applicant and right-of-way user in a competitively neutral and nondiscriminatory manner, to the extent required by law, while taking into account the unique https://waterloowi.sharepoint.com/sites/Fileshares/data/Common/ORDINANCES/2021 ORDINANCES/2_PROPOSED/2021-06 5G/2021-06 Amending Article IV Wireless Facilities.docx 7/13/2021 7:07 PM technologies, situation, and legal status of each applicant or request for use of the right-of-way.

Section 5: Administration

(a) Administrator. The administrator is responsible for administering this Chapter.

(b) **Powers**. As part of the administration of this Chapter, the administrator may:

(1) Adopt wireless regulations governing the placement and modification of wireless facilities in addition to but consistent with the requirements of this Chapter, including regulations governing collocation, the resolution of conflicting applications for placement of wireless facilities, and aesthetic standards. The regulations must be published in advance of their enforcement.

(2) Interpret the provisions of the Chapter and the wireless regulations.

(3) Develop forms and procedures for submission of applications for wireless permits consistent with this Chapter.

(4) Collect any fee required by this Chapter.

(5) Establish deadlines for submission of information related to an application, and extend or shorten deadlines where appropriate and consistent with federal laws and regulations.

(6) Issue notices of incompleteness or requests for information in connection with any wireless permit application.

(7) Select and retain an independent consultant or attorney with expertise in telecommunications to review any issue that involves specialized or expert knowledge in connection with any permit application.

(8) Coordinate and consult with other City of Waterloo staff, committees, and governing bodies to ensure timely action on all other required permits under Section 6(b)(11) of this Chapter.

(9) Negotiate attachment agreements for the placement of wireless equipment on governmental poles or utility poles for designated.

(10) Subject to appeal as provided in Section 8(d) of this Chapter, determine whether to grant, grant subject to conditions, or deny an application.

(11) Take such other steps as may be required to timely act upon wireless permit applications, including issuing written decisions and entering into agreements to mutually extend the time for action on an application.

Section 6: Application

(a) **Format.** Unless the wireless regulations provide otherwise, the applicant must submit both a paper copy and an electronic copy (in a searchable format) of any application, as well as any amendments or supplements to the application or responses to requests for information regarding an application, to the Administrator. An application is not complete until both the paper and electronic copies are received by the Administrator.

(b) **Content.** In order to be considered complete, an application must contain:

(1) All information required pursuant to the wireless regulations.

(2) A completed application cover sheet signed by an authorized representative of the applicant.

(3) The name of the applicant (including any corporate or trade name), and the name, address, email address, and telephone number of a local representative and of all duly authorized representatives and consultants acting on behalf of the applicant with respect to the filing of the application. If the applicant is a wireless infrastructure provider, the name and contact information for the wireless service provider(s) that will be using the wireless facility must also be provided.

(4) A statement of which state or federal deadline(s) apply to the application.

(5) A separate and complete description of each proposed wireless facility and the work that will be required to install or modify it, including but not limited to detail regarding proposed excavations, if any; detailed site plans showing the location of the facility and technical specifications for each element of the facility, clearly describing the site and all structures and equipment at the site before and after installation or modification and identifying the owners of such preexisting structures and equipment; and describing the distance to the nearest residential dwelling unit. Before and after 360-degree photo simulations must be provided for each facility.

(6) A certification by the applicant that the wireless facility will not materially interfere with the safe operation of traffic control equipment or sight lines or clear zones for transportation of pedestrians, and will fully comply with the federal Americans with Disabilities Act or similar federal or state standards regarding pedestrian access or movement.

(7) A certification by the applicant that the wireless facility will comply with relevant FCC regulations concerning radio frequency emissions from radio transmitters and unacceptable interference with public safety spectrum, including compliance with the abatement and resolution procedures for interference with public safety spectrum established by the FCC set forth in 47 C.F.R. §§ 22.97 to 22.973 and 47 C.F.R. §§ 90.672 to 90.675.

(8) A statement that the wireless facility will comply with the state electrical wiring code, as defined in Wis. Stat. § 101.80(4), as amended; the state plumbing code specified in Wis. Stat. § 145.13, as amended; the fire prevention code under Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 314, as amended; the Wisconsin commercial building code under Wis. Admin. Code §§ SPS 361 to 366, as amended; the Wisconsin uniform dwelling code under Wis. Admin. Code §§ SPS 320 to 325, as amended; and all local amendments to those codes enacted solely to address imminent threats of destruction of property or injury to persons.

(9) A structural report performed by a professional engineer registered in the State of Wisconsin evidencing that the support structure on which the wireless equipment will be mounted will structurally support the equipment, or that the structure may and will be modified to meet structural requirements, in accordance with applicable codes, including the National Electric Safety Code and the National Electric Code.

(10) If the support structure on which the wireless equipment will be mounted is owned by a third party, a certification that the applicant has permission from the owner to mount its equipment on the structure. This is not required if the support structure is a governmental pole or a utility pole for designated services, as permission will be evidenced by the executed attachment agreement referenced in Section 3(c).

(11) To the extent that filing of the wireless permit application establishes a deadline for action on any other permit that may be required in connection with the wireless facility, the application must include complete copies of applications for every required permit (including without limitation electrical permits, building permits, traffic control permits, and excavation permits), with all engineering completed.

(12) Payment of all required fees.

(c) **Waivers**. Requests for waivers from any requirement of this Section 6 shall be made in writing to the Administrator. The Administrator may grant a request for waiver if it is demonstrated that, notwithstanding the issuance of the waiver, the City of Waterloo will be provided with all information necessary to understand the nature of the construction or other activity to be conducted pursuant to the wireless permit sought.

(d) **Eligible Facilities Requests**. If the applicant asserts in writing that its application is an eligible facilities request, the City of Waterloo will only require the applicant to provide that information set forth in subsection (b) to the extent reasonably related to determining whether the request meets the definition of "eligible facilities request" under 47 C.F.R. § 1.6100(b)(3). The applicant will be required to submit evidence that the application relates to an existing tower or base station that has been approved by the City of Waterloo. Before and after 360-degree photo simulations must be provided with detailed specifications demonstration that the modification does not substantially change the physical dimensions of the existing approved tower or base station.

(e) **Fees**. Applicant must pay an application fee in an amount set by the Common Council to allow recovery of the City of Waterloo's direct costs of processing the application, subject to the limits contained in state and federal law, including Wis. Stat. § 66.0414(3)(d), as amended.

(f) **Public Records**. Applications are public records that may be made publicly available pursuant to state and federal public records law. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the applicant may designate portions of the application materials that it reasonably believes contain proprietary or confidential information by clearly marking each portion of such materials accordingly, and the City of Waterloo shall endeavor to treat the information as proprietary and confidential, subject to applicable state and federal public records laws and the Administrator's determination that the applicant's request for confidential or proprietary treatment of the application materials is reasonable. The City of Waterloo shall not be required to incur any costs to protect the application from disclosure.

Section 7: General Standards

(a) **Generally**. Wireless facilities shall meet the minimum requirements set forth in this Chapter and the wireless regulations, in addition to the requirements of any other applicable law or regulation.

(b) **Regulations**. The wireless regulations and decisions on wireless permits shall, at a minimum, ensure that the requirements of this Chapter are satisfied, unless it is determined that the applicant has established that denial of an application would, within the meaning of federal law, prohibit or effectively prohibit the provision of telecommunications or personal wireless services, or otherwise violate applicable laws or regulations. If that determination is made, the requirements of this Chapter and the wireless regulations may be waived, but only to the extent required to avoid the prohibition.

(c) Standards.

(1) Wireless facilities shall be installed and modified in a manner that:

(A) Minimizes risks to public safety;

(B) Ensures that placement of wireless equipment on existing support structures is within the tolerance of those structures;

(C) Ensures that new support structures will not be installed when the applicant has the right to place its wireless facility on an existing structure on reasonable terms and conditions and placement in that location is technically feasible and not materially more expensive;

(D) Avoids installation or modification of a utility pole that would exceed the height limits set forth in Wis. Stat. § 66.0414(2)(e)2, as amended;

(E) Avoids placement of aboveground wireless facilities in historic districts and underground districts (except for placing equipment on or replacing pre-existing support structures, so long as the collocation or replacement reasonably conforms to the design aesthetics of the original support structure);

(F) Avoids placement of wireless facilities in residential areas when commercial or industrial areas are reasonably available;(G) Maintains the integrity and character of the neighborhoods and corridors in which the facilities are located;

(H) Ensures that the City of Waterloo bears no risk or liability as a result of the installations; and

(I) Ensures that applicant's use does not obstruct or hinder travel, drainage, maintenance, or the public health, safety, and general welfare; inconvenience the public; interfere with the primary uses of the right-of-way; or hinder the ability of the City of Waterloo or other government entities to improve, modify, relocate, abandon, or vacate the right-of-way or any portion thereof, or to cause the improvement, modification, relocation, vacation, or abandonment of facilities in the right-of-way.

(2) In no event may ground-mounted equipment interfere with pedestrian or vehicular traffic and at all times must comply with the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990.

(d) **Standard Permit Conditions**. All wireless permits, whether granted under this Chapter or deemed granted by operation of state or federal law, are issued subject to the following minimum conditions:

(1) **Compliance**. The permit holder shall at all times maintain compliance with all applicable Federal, State, and local laws, regulations, and other rules.

(2) **Construction Deadline**. The permit holder shall commence the activity authorized by the permit no later than 365 days after the permit is granted and shall pursue work on the activity until completion.

(3) **Contact Information**. The permit holder shall at all times maintain with the City of Waterloo accurate contact information for the permit holder and all wireless service providers making use of the facility, which shall include a phone number, mailing address, and email address for at least one natural person.

(4) **Emergencies**. The City of Waterloo shall have the right to support, repair, disable, or remove any elements of the facilities in emergencies or when the facility threatens imminent harm to persons or property.

(5) **Indemnification**. The permit holder, by accepting a permit under this Chapter, agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the City of Waterloo, its elected and appointed officials, officers, employees, agents, representatives, and volunteers (collectively, the "Indemnified Parties") from and against any and all liability and loss from personal injury or property damage resulting from or arising out of, in whole or in part, the use or occupancy of rights-of-way by the permit holder

or anyone acting under its direction or control or on its behalf arising out of the rights and privileges granted under this Chapter, even if liability is also sought to be imposed on one or more of the Indemnified Parties. The obligation to indemnify, and hold harmless the Indemnified Parties shall be applicable even if the liability results in part from an act or failure to act on the part of one or more of the Indemnified Parties. However, the obligation does not apply if the liability results from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of an Indemnified Party.

(6) **Adverse Impacts on Adjacent Properties**. The permit holder shall undertake all reasonable efforts to avoid undue adverse impacts to adjacent properties and/or uses that may arise from the construction, operation, maintenance, modification, or removal of the facility.

(7) **General Maintenance**. The wireless facility and any associated structures shall be maintained in a neat and clean manner and in accordance with all approved plans and conditions of approval.

(8) **Graffiti Removal**. All graffiti on facilities shall be removed at the sole expense of the permit holder within 48 hours after notification from the City of Waterloo.

(9) **Relocation**. At the request of the City of Waterloo pursuant to Section 10 of this Chapter, the permit holder shall promptly and at its own expense permanently remove and relocate its wireless facility in the right-of-way.

(10) **Abandonment**. The permit holder shall promptly notify the City of Waterloo whenever a facility has not been in use for a continuous period of 60 days or longer and must comply with Section 11 of this Chapter.

(11) **Restoration**. A permit holder who removes or relocates a facility from the right-of-way or otherwise causes any damage to the right-of-way in connection with its activities under this Chapter must restore the right-of-way in accordance with Section 12 of this Chapter.

(12) **Record Retention**. The permit holder shall retain full and complete copies of all permits and other regulatory approvals issued in connection with the facility, which includes without limitation all conditions of approval, approved plans, resolutions, and other documentation associated with the permit or regulatory approval. In the event the City of Waterloo cannot locate any such full and complete permits or other regulatory approvals in its official records, and the permit holder fails to retain full and complete records in the permit holder's files, any ambiguities or uncertainties that would be resolved through an examination of the missing documents will be conclusively resolved against the permit holder.

(13) **Radio Frequency Emissions**. Every wireless facility shall at all times comply with applicable FCC regulations governing radio frequency emissions, and failure to comply with such regulations shall be treated as a material violation of the terms of the permit.

(14) **Certificate of Insurance**. A certificate of insurance sufficient to demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Administrator that the applicant has the capability to cover any liability that might arise out of the presence of the facility in the right-of-way.

Section 8: Application Processing and Appeal

(a) **Rejection for Incompleteness**. Notices of incompleteness shall be provided in conformity with state, local, and federal law, including 47 C.F.R. § 1.6003(d) and Wis. Stat. § 66.0414(3)(c), as amended. https://waterloowi.sharepoint.com/sites/Fileshares/data/Common/ORDINANCES/2021 ORDINANCES/2_PROPOSED/2021-06 5G/2021-06 Amending Article IV Wireless Facilities.docx 7/13/2021 7:07 PM (b) **Processing Timeline**. Wireless permit applications (including applications for other permits under Section 6(b)(11) necessary to place or modify the facility) and appeals will be processed in conformity with the deadlines set forth in state, local, and federal law, as amended, unless the applicant and the City of Waterloo agree to an extension.

(c) **Written Decision**. In the event that an application is denied (or approved with conditions beyond the standard permit conditions set forth in Section 7(d)), the Administrator shall issue a written decision with the reasons therefor, supported by substantial evidence contained in a written record. If the permit is for a small wireless facility, the applicant may cure the deficiencies identified in the written decision denying the permit and re-submit the application no later than 30 days after receipt without being required to pay an additional application fee.

(d) **Appeal to City Council.** Any person adversely affected by the decision of the Administrator may appeal that decision to the Waterloo Utility Commission or Waterloo Common Council, which may decide the issues *de novo*, and whose written decision will be the final decision of the City. An appeal by a wireless infrastructure provider must be taken jointly with the wireless service provider that intends to use the wireless facility. If an applicant contends that denial of the application would prohibit or effectively prohibit the provision of service in violation of federal law, or otherwise violate applicable law, the documentation accompanying the appeal must include that contention and provide all evidence on which the applicant relies in support of that claim.

(e) Deadline to Appeal.

(1) Appeals that involve eligible facilities requests must be filed within three business days of the written decision of the Administrator.

(2) All other appeals not governed by Section 8(e)(1), above, must be filed within seven business days of the written decision of the Administrator, unless the Administrator extends the time therefor. An extension may not be granted where extension would result in approval of the application by operation of law.

(d) **Decision Deadline**. All appeals shall be conducted so that a timely written decision may be issued in accordance with the applicable deadline.

Section 9: Revocation

(a) **Revocation for Breach**. A wireless permit may be revoked for failure to comply with the conditions of the permit or applicable federal, state, or local laws, rules, or regulations. Upon revocation, the facilities for which the permit has been revoked must be removed within 30 days of receipt of written notice from the City of Waterloo. All costs incurred by the City of Waterloo in connection with the revocation, removal, and right-of-way restoration shall be paid by the permit holder.

(b) **Failure to Obtain Permit**. Unless exempted from permitting by Section 3(b) of this Chapter, a wireless facility installed without a wireless permit must be removed within 30 days of receipt of written notice from the City of Waterloo. All costs incurred by the City of Waterloo in connection with the notice, removal, and right-of-way restoration shall be paid by the entities who own or control any part of the wireless facility.

Section 10: Relocation

Except as otherwise prohibited by state or federal law, a permit holder must promptly and at its own expense, with due regard for seasonal working conditions and as directed by the City of Waterloo, https://waterloowi.sharepoint.com/sites/Fileshares/data/Common/ORDINANCES/2021 ORDINANCES/2_PROPOSED/2021-06 5G/2021-06 Amending Article IV Wireless Facilities.docx 7/13/2021 7:07 PM permanently remove and relocate any of its wireless facilities in the right-of-way whenever such relocation is necessary to prevent the wireless facility from interfering with a present or future City of Waterloo use of the right-of-way; a public improvement undertaken by the City of Waterloo; an economic development project in which the City of Waterloo has an interest or investment; when the public health, safety, or welfare require it; or when necessary to prevent interference with the safety and convenience of ordinary travel over the right-of-way. Notwithstanding the foregoing, a permit holder shall not be required to remove or relocate its facilities from any right-of-way that has been vacated in favor of a non-governmental entity unless and until that entity pays the reasonable costs of removal or relocation to the permit holder.

Section 11: Abandonment

(a) **Cessation of Use**. In the event that a permitted facility within the right-of-way is not in use for a continuous period of 60 days or longer, the permit holder must promptly notify the City of Waterloo and do one of the following:

(1) Provide information satisfactory to the Administrator that the permit holder's obligations for its facilities under this Chapter have been lawfully assumed by another permit holder.

(2) Submit to the Administrator a proposal and instruments for dedication of the facilities to the City. If a permit holder proceeds under this Section 11(a)(2), the City of Waterloo may, at its option:

(A) Accept the dedication for all or a portion of the facilities;

(B) Require the permit holder, at its own expense, to remove the facilities and perform the required restoration under Section 12; or

(C) Require the permit holder to post a bond or provide payment sufficient to reimburse the City of Waterloo for reasonably anticipated costs to be incurred in removing the facilities and undertaking restoration under Section 12.

(3) Remove its facilities from the right-of-way within one year and perform the required restoration under Section 12, unless the Administrator waives this requirement or provides a later deadline.

(b) **Abandoned Facilities**. Facilities of a permit holder who fails to comply with Section 11(a) and which, for one year, remain unused shall be deemed to be abandoned. Abandoned facilities are deemed to be a nuisance. In addition to any remedies or rights it has at law or in equity, the City of Waterloo may, at its option:

(1) abate the nuisance and recover the cost from the permit holder or the permit holder's successor in interest;

(2) take possession of the facilities; and/or

(3) require removal of the facilities by the permit holder or the permit holder's successor in interest.

Section 12: Restoration

In the event that a permit holder removes or is required to remove a wireless facility from the right-ofway under this Chapter (or relocate it pursuant to Section 10), or otherwise causes any damage to the right-of-way in connection with its activities under this Chapter, the permit holder must restore the https://waterloowi.sharepoint.com/sites/Fileshares/data/Common/ORDINANCES/2021 ORDINANCES/2_PROPOSED/2021-06 5G/2021-06 Amending Article IV Wireless Facilities.docx 7/13/2021 7:07 PM right-of-way to its prior condition in accordance with City of Waterloo specifications. However, a support structure owned by another entity authorized to maintain that support structure in the right-of-way need not be removed but must instead be restored to its prior condition. If the permit holder fails to make the restorations required by this Section 12, the City of Waterloo at its option may do such work after providing 15 days' written notice to the permit holder. In that event, the permit holder shall pay to the City of Waterloo, within 30 days of billing therefor, the cost of restoring the right-of-way.

Section 13: Severability

If any section, subsection, clause, phrase, or portion of this Chapter is for any reason held to be illegal or otherwise invalid by any court or administrative agency of competent jurisdiction, such illegal or invalid portion shall be severable and shall not affect or impair any remaining portion of this Chapter, which shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 14: Use Fee

The permit holder must pay to the City an annual fee to use the right of way (Use Fee). The Use Fee shall equal the maximum fee allowable under Wis. Stat. § 66.0414(2)(c). The permit holder shall be invoiced for the first Use Fee on the date the permit is issued, prorated based on the proportion of the calendar year then remaining. Subsequent invoicing shall be prospective and occur each January. If the permit holder fails to pay the Use Fee within 30 days after it is due, the permit holder shall pay interest of two percent per month on the amount past due.

SECTION B: This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and posting as provided by law.


