- CALL TO ORDER, PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE AND ROLL CALL. Mayor Thompson called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Alderpersons present: Ziaja, Springer, Griffin, Thomas, Stinnett and Petts. Absent: Quimby. Others present: Diane Graff, the Courier; Interim Police Chief Lange; WLOO videographers; Gary Yerges; Chad Yerges; Chris Hauptli; Jeff Robbins; Municipal Attorney Mike Hahn; Bill Blaska; Lyle Braunschweig and Clerk/Treasurer Hansen. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.
- 2. MEETING MINUTES APPROVAL: March 16, 2017. MOTION: Moved by Thomas, seconded by Stinnett to approve the minutes as presented. VOICE VOTE: Motion carried.
- 3. PUBLIC COMMENT. None.
- 4. CONSENT AGENDA ITEMS. MOTION: Moved by Springer, seconded by Griffin to approve the consent agenda items. VOICE VOTE: Motion carried.

 - Ordinance #2017- 03 An Ordinance To Rezone 1212 Main Street, City Of Waterloo, Jefferson County, Wisconsin From C-2 Highway Commercial District To R-2, Single Family Residential District. DISCUSSION: Springer said the Plan Commission recommended approval. MOTION: Moved by Springer, seconded by Thomas to approve the ordinance as presented. ROLL CALL VOTE: Ayes: Ziaja, Springer, Griffin, Thomas, Stinnett and Petts. Noes: none with Quimby absent. Motion carried.
 - ii. Resolution #2017-12 Granting A Conditional Use Permit To Katherine Zwieg (On Behalf Of Chatty Properties LLC), 1212 Main Street, City Of Waterloo, Jefferson County To Allow For Two Dwelling Units In A R-2, Single Family Residential District. DISCUSSION: Springer said the Plan Commission added two conditions: (1) The applicant is to provide a certified plan to the Building Inspector showing minimum entrance requirements; and (2) The improvements are to be completed within six months. MOTION: Moved by Springer, seconded by Thomas to approve the resolution adding the following conditions: (1) The applicant is to provide a certified plan to the Building Inspector showing minimum entrance requirements. (2) The improvements are to be completed within six months. ROLL CALL VOTE: Ayes: Ziaja, Springer, Griffin, Thomas, Stinnett and Petts. Noes: none with Quimby absent. Motion carried.
- 6. UNFINISHED BUSINESS
 - a. Ordinance #2017-02 An Ordinance Amending Section 350-13 Of The Municipal Code Off-Road Vehicles – Authorizing The Use Of All Terrain Vehicles And Utility Terrain Vehicles On Clarkson Road And Main Street. DISCUSSION: Noting that the Town of Portland permits ATV and UTV use, Thomas said the ordinance would allow such vehicles to be used only on those roads shared with the Town of Portland, Clarkson Road and Main Street. MOTION: Moved by Thomas, seconded by Petts to approve the ordinance as recommended and presented. ROLL CALL VOTE: Ayes: Ziaja, Springer, Griffin, Thomas, Stinnett and Petts. Noes: none with Quimby absent. Motion carried. AGENDA NOTE: At this time a motion was made by Springer, seconded by Thomas to hold closed

AGENDA NOTE: At this time a motion was made by Springer, seconded by Thomas to hold closed session discussions for both 6b together with 7c. VOICE VOTE: Motion carried. For the purpose of meeting minute sequencing, the items remain in original sequence.

b. Claim For Excessive Assessment For Monroe Street Apartments LLC, Parcel Number 290-0813-0644-026. MOTION: Moved by Springer, seconded by Thomas to convene to closed session. VOICE VOTE: Motion carried. The Council convened to closed session per Wis. Stat. 19.85(1)(g) "conferring with legal counsel for the governmental body who is rendering oral or written advice concerning strategy to be adopted by the body with respect to litigation which it is or is likely to become involved." Upon completion of the closed session the body reconvened into open session. MOTION: Moved by Springer, seconded by Griffin to approve an agreement with Monroe Street Apartment LLC as presented on this night by municipal attorney Mike Hahn subject to the execution of the agreement by the claimant, and further noting that the Mayor is authorized to sign on behalf of the City. ROLL CALL VOTE: Ayes: Ziaja,

Springer, Griffin, Thomas, Stinnett and Petts. Noes: none with Quimby absent. Motion carried.

- 7. NEW BUSINESS
 - a. Resolution #2017-09 Declaring Outlot 1 Of Certified Survey Map 4845-25-134 (Parcel 29008130511013) A Buildable Parcel Within A Residential District For Purposes Of Condition Set Forth On The Map And Recorded Restrictive Covenants. DISCUSSION: Hansen said a recorded restrictive covenant existed declaring Outlot 1 unbuildable. Hansen said the resolution purpose was to declare it buildable with the understanding that a new certified survey map would need to be approved striking "Outlot 1" substituting a lot number. He said the property owner was interested in building a home on the parcel; that the County received notice that the site passed a perc test; and that the City Engineer did not object. In reply to the Thompson question he said a new home was being construct on an adjacent lot (Note: incorrectly identified by Hansen as Lot 2). MOTION: Moved by Ziaja, seconded by Stinnett to approve the resolution as presented. ROLL CALL VOTE: Ayes: Ziaja, Springer, Griffin, Thomas, Stinnett and Petts. Noes: none with Quimby absent. Motion carried.
 - b. Resolution #2017-10 Council Confirmation Of The Mayoral Appointment Of Chad Yerges As Interim Public Works Director. DISCUSSION: Springer listed prior interim positions in the Police Department and Clerk/Treasurer's office where the interim position was paid the same rate of pay as a Department Head. He said the same should be the case in this situation. MOTION: Moved by Springer, seconded by Griffin to approve the resolution amended to have the pay rate of the Interim Director be the same as the Director. ROLL CALL VOTE: Ayes: Ziaja, Springer, Griffin, Thomas, Stinnett and Petts. Noes: none with Quimby absent. Motion carried.
 - c. Resolution #2017-11 Authorizing The Hiring Of Michael J. Kawula As Assistant Deputy Clerk/Treasurer. MOTION: Moved by Springer, seconded by Thomas to convene in closed session. The Council convened to closed session per Wis. Stat. 19.85(1)(c) "Considering employment, promotion, compensation or performance data of any public employee over which the governmental body has jurisdiction or exercises responsibility." Upon completion of the closed session it reconvened into open session. MOTION: Moved by Ziaja, seconded by Petts to approve the resolution as presented. ROLL CALL VOTE: Ayes: Ziaja, Griffin, Stinnett and Petts. Noes: Thomas and Springer. Motion carried.

Notice is hereby given that the **2017 Assessment Roll** of the City of Waterloo will be open for examination in the Council Room of the Municipal Building, 136 N Monroe Street on **Monday, April 24, 2017 from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.** Additionally, the assessor shall be available on the 24th day of April, 2017 at City Hall from 2:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.

All property owners whose real estate assessment was changed will receive a written notice of their new and former assessments.

Notice is hereby given that the Board of Review for the City of Waterloo, Jefferson County, Wisconsin, shall hold its first meeting on Wednesday, May 17, 2017, at 2:00 p.m., in the Council Room of the Municipal Building.

Please be advised of the following requirements to appear before the board of review and procedural requirements if appearing before the board:

- 1. No person will be allowed to appear before the board of review, to testify to the board by telephone, or to contest the amount of any assessment of real or personal property if the person has refused a reasonable written request by certified mail of the assessor to view the property.
- 2. After the first meeting of the board of review and before the board's final adjournment, no person who is scheduled to appear before the board of review may contact or provide information to a member of the board about the person's objection, except at a session of the board.
- 3. The board of review may not hear an objection to the amount or valuation of property unless, at least 48 hours before the board's first scheduled meeting, the objector provides to the board's clerk written or oral notice of an intent to file an objection, except that upon a showing of good cause and the submission of a written objection, the board shall waive that requirement during the first 2 hours of the board's first scheduled meeting, and the board may waive that requirement up to the end of the 5th day of the session or up to the end of the final day of the session if the session is less than 5 days with proof of extraordinary circumstances for failure to meet the 48-hour notice requirement and failure to appear before the board of review during the first 2 hours of the first scheduled meeting.
- 4. Objections to the amount or valuation of property shall first be made in writing and filed with the clerk of the board of review within the first 2 hours of the board's first scheduled meeting, except that, upon evidence of extraordinary circumstances, the board may waive that requirement up to the end of the 5th day of the session or up to the end of the final day of the session if the session is less than 5 days. The board may require objections to the amount or valuation of property to be submitted on forms approved by the Department of Revenue, and the board shall require that any forms include stated valuations of the property in question. Persons who own land and improvements to that land may object to the aggregate valuation of that land may object only to the valuation of that land or only to the valuation of improvements to that land. No person may be allowed in any action or proceedings to question the amount or valuation of property unless the written objection has been filed and that person in good faith

presented evidence to the board in support of the objections and made full disclosure before the board, under oath, of all of that person's property liable to assessment in the district and the value of that property. The requirement that objections be in writing may be waived by express action of the board.

- 5. When appearing before the board of review, the objecting person shall specify in writing the person's estimate of the value of the land and of the improvements that are the subject of the person's objection and specify the information that the person used to arrive at that estimate.
- 6. No person may appear before the board of review, testify to the board by telephone, or object to a valuation if that valuation was made by the assessor or the objector using the income method of valuation, unless the person supplies the assessor with all the information about income and expenses, as specified in the assessor's manual under s. 73.03 (2a), Wis. stats., that the assessor requests. The City of Waterloo has an ordinance for the confidentiality of information about income and expenses that is provided to the assessor under this paragraph that provides exceptions for persons using information in the discharge of duties imposed by law or the duties of their officer or by order of a court.* The information that is provided under this paragraph, unless a court determined that it is inaccurate, is not subject to the right of inspection and copying under s. 19.35 (1), Wis. stats.
- 7. The board shall hear upon oath, by telephone, all ill or disabled persons who present to the board a letter from a physician, surgeon, or osteopath that confirms their illness or disability. No other persons may testify by telephone unless the Board, in it's discretion, has determined to grant a property owner's or their representative's request to testify under oath by telephone or written statement.
- 8. No person may appear before the board of review, testify to the board by telephone, or contest the amount of any assessment unless, at least 48 hours before the first meeting of the board, or at least 48 hours before the objection is heard if the objection is allowed under s.70.47 (3) (a), Wis. stats., that person provides to the clerk of the board of review notice as to whether the person will ask for the removal of a member of the board of review and, if so, which member, and provides a reasonable estimate of the length of time the hearing will take.

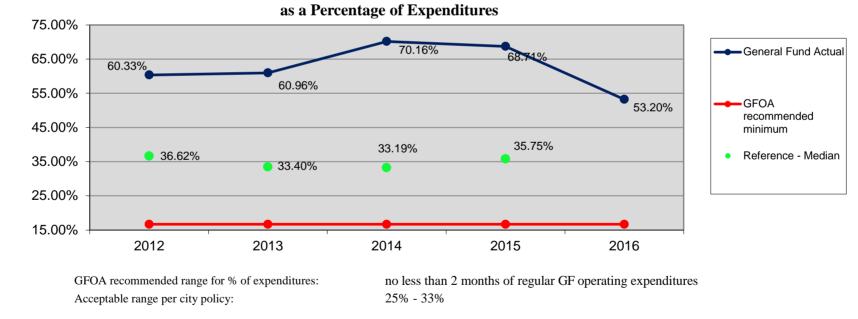

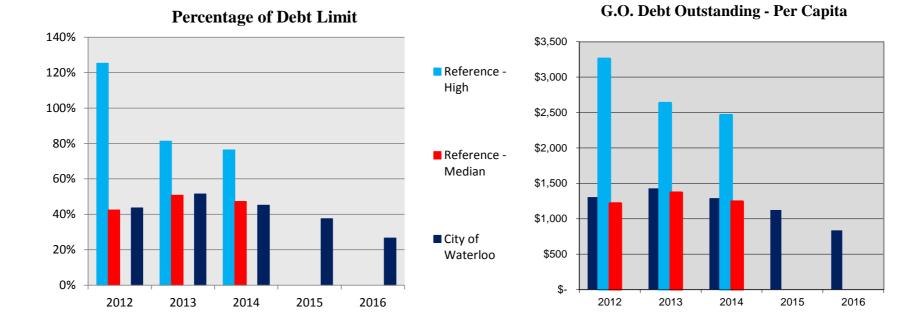
Unreserved or Unrestricted General Fund Balance

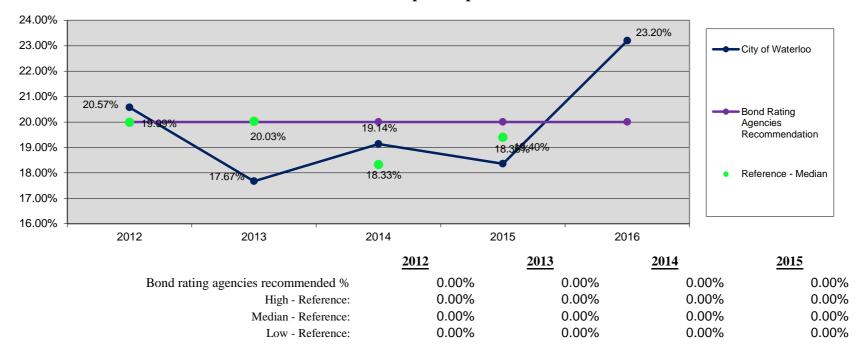

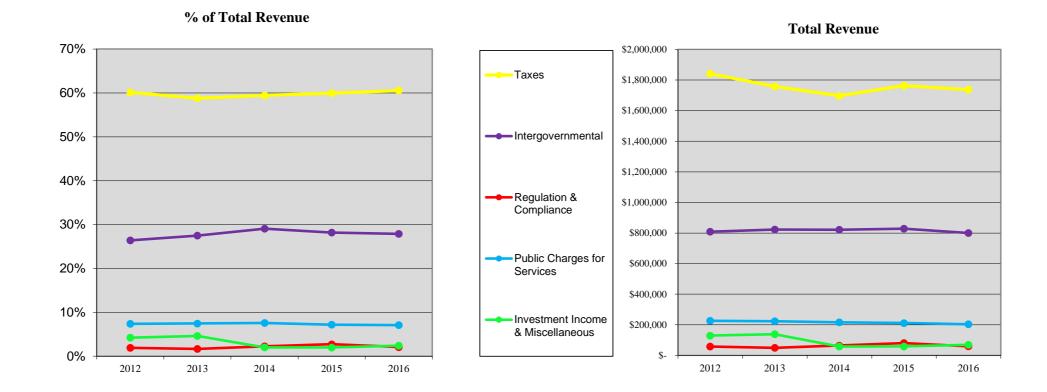
Debt Service to Non-Capital Expenditures

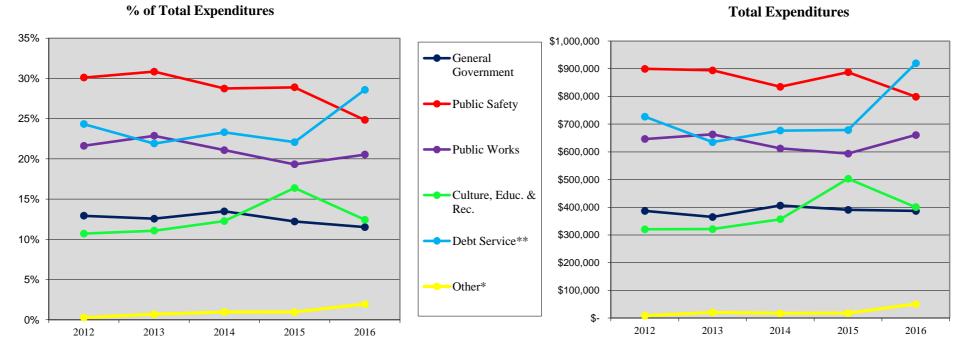

Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Waterloo Water and Light Commission, an enterprise fund of the City of Waterloo, Wisconsin, as of and for the years ended December 31, 2016 and 2015, and the related notes to the financial statements, as listed in the table of contents.

MANAGEMENT'S DISCUSSION

AND ANALYSIS

MANAGEMENT'S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS As of and for the Years Ended December 31, 2016 and 2015

The management of the Waterloo Water and Light Commission (utility) offers all persons interested in the financial position of the utility this narrative overview and analysis of the utility's financial performance during the fiscal years ending December 31, 2016 and 2015. You are invited to read this narrative in conjunction with the utility's financial statements.

FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

The following summarizes the operating results of each utility.

ELECTRIC UTILITY EARNINGS

Operating income decreased from \$297,000 in 2015 to \$243,000 in 2016. Revenues decreased 5.72% as a result of a decrease in sales volume. Operating expenses decreased 4.87% due to the decrease in purchased power. The rate of return decreased from 6.81% to 5.08% in 2016.

WATER UTILITY EARNINGS

The water utility had an operating income of \$221,000 in 2016 compared to \$227,000 in 2015, a decrease of 2.73%. There was not a significant change in operating revenue in 2016. Operating expenses increased 0.80% in 2016. The rate of return increased from 4.96% to 5.54% in 2016.

Sewer Utility EARNINGS

The sewer utility had an operating income in 2016 of \$213,000 compared to \$231,000 in 2015. Operating revenues decrease by 3.63% due to lower usage in 2016 compared to 2015. Operating expenses decreased by 2.38% in 2016.

DEBT COVERAGE

The actual combined debt coverage for 2016 was 2.16 which exceeds the requirement of 1.25.

MANAGEMENT'S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS As of and for the Years Ended December 31, 2016 and 2015

OVERVIEW OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS/USING THIS REPORT

The Waterloo Water and Light Commission is an enterprise fund of the City of Waterloo. The purpose of the utility is to provide electric, water and sewer service to properties located within the municipality and selected areas outside the city.

This annual report consists of two parts: Management's Discussion and Analysis (this section) and the basic financial statements. The Waterloo Water and Light Commission is a self-supporting entity and follows enterprise fund reporting; accordingly, the financial statements are presented using the economic resources measurement focus and the accrual basis of accounting. Enterprise fund statements offer short- and long-term financial information about the activities and operations of the Waterloo Water and Light Commission.

- > The Statements of Net Position includes all of the Waterloo Water and Light Commission's assets, liabilities, deferred outflows of resources, deferred inflows of resources and net position, and provides information about the nature and amount of investments in resources and the obligations to creditors. This statement provides the basis for evaluating the capital structure and assessing the liquidity and financial flexibility of the Waterloo Water and Light Commission.
- > The Statements of Revenues, Expenses, and Changes in Net Position provide an indication of the Waterloo Water and Light Commission's financial health.
- > The Statements of Cash Flows report the cash provided and used by operating activities, as well as other cash sources such as investment income and cash payments for repayment of bonds and capital additions.

UTILITY FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

An analysis of the utility's financial position begins with a review of the Statements of Net Position, and the Statements of Revenues, Expenses and Changes in Net Position report information. These two statements report the utility's net position and changes therein. The utility's net position – "the difference between assets, deferred outflows, and liabilities" is key to measuring the financial health of the utility. Over time, increases or decreases in the net position value are an indicator of whether the financial position is improving or deteriorating. However, it should be noted that the financial position can also be affected by other non-financial factors, including economic conditions, customer growth, climate conditions and new regulations.

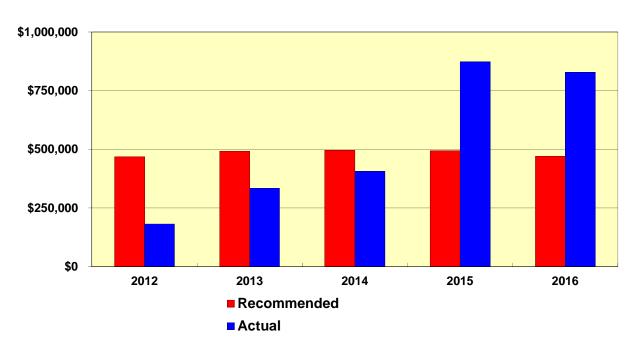

A utility should maintain funds to cover its operations in a normal business operating cycle (i.e. quarterly, monthly) plus a contingency. In addition, utilities should have available an amount equal to one year's capital improvements. These funding levels facilitate budgeting since there will be less concern for business cycle fluctuations.

This shows that the utility had slightly decreased their cash reserves in 2016. In 2015 and 2016 the utility has cash reserves on hand greater than the amounts recommended. The utility took out new debt in 2012, 2013 and 2016 in order to fund capital projects which combined with recent rate adjustments has allowed unrestricted funds on hand to increase to more acceptable levels.

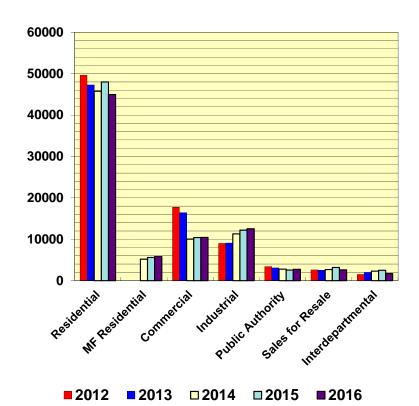

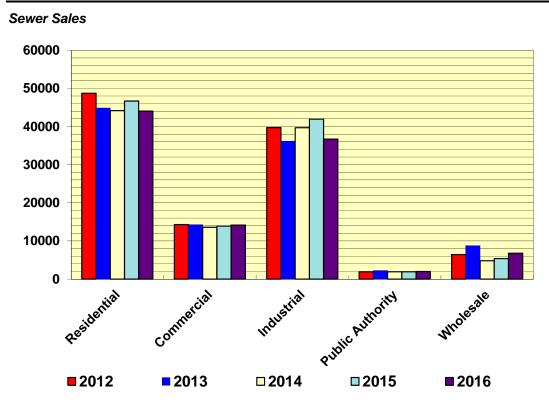

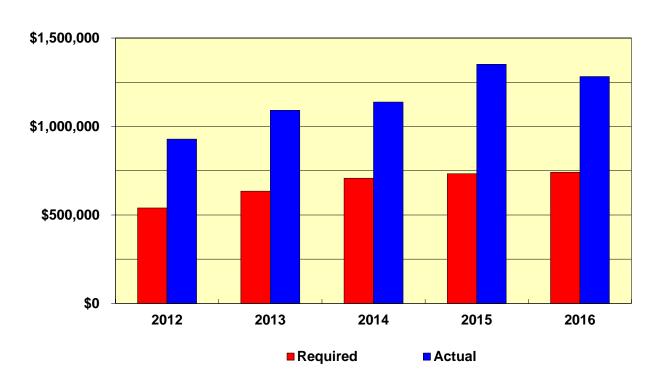
