MEETING MINUTES APPROVAL: January 17, 2019. Motion: Moved by Quimby, seconded by Thomas to approve the meeting minutes as presented. VOICE VOTE: Motion carried.

PUBLIC COMMENT. Jim Rhyner started making a comment about zoning, and the Mayor indicated that it related to matter on the agenda.

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES, COMMISSIONS AND BOARDS

- a. Plan Commission
 - i. Application For Conditional Use Permit, SAC Wireless (on behalf of AT&T) To Allow For The Construction Of A 190 Foot Telecommunications Tower In Firemen's Park (Commission Recommendation Permit Denial). MOTION: Moved by Springer, seconded by Quimby to deny the application based on the following reasons: (a) the proposed tower is in a public park in an area open and accessible to children playing and for recreation. The tower is an unsupervised safety hazard for children in a public park and poses a danger to children. (b) It has not been determined that noise levels created by a generator necessary for the tower's operation will not exceed municipal standards. ROLL CALL VOTE: Ayes: Osborn, Quimby, Springer, Griffin, Thomas, Stinnett and Petts. Noes: none, the motion to deny the permit is approved.
- b. Public Works & Property Committee
 - i. Resolution #2019-03 Awarding A Street and Utility Construction Contract for 2019 Improvements To Edison and Franklin Streets. MOTION: Moved by Springer, seconded by Stinnett to approve the resolution awarding the contract to Forest Landscaping & Construction Inc. of Lake Mills in the amount of \$908,045. ROLL CALL VOTE: Ayes: Osborn, Quimby, Springer, Griffin, Thomas, Stinnett and Petts. Noes: none the motion carried.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

a. Resolution #2019-01 Preliminary Resolution Declaring Intent To Levy Special Assessments Under Police Power Pursuant To §66.0703, Wis. Stats. DISCUSSION: Springer said an ordinance amendment was under Plan Commission consideration. Saying assessments were inconsistently applied, he called for assessments just for new construction and none for the Edison Street – Franklin Street project. Thomas mentioned pro-rated costs related to newer sidewalk. Griffin said walk repairs on the new side should not be required. MOTION: Moved by Springer, seconded by Stinnett to reject the amendment. ROLL CALL VOTE: Ayes: Osborn, Quimby, Springer, Griffin, Thomas, Stinnett and Petts. Noes: none. The resolution failed.

- c. Resolution #2019-02 Confirmation of Mayoral Fire Chief Appointment Per Section §85-3 Of The Municipal Code. MOTION: Moved by Quimby, seconded by Griffin to approve the resolution. VOICE VOTE: Motion carried.

WHEREAS, we would like to express our appreciation to Chief Vern Butzine and honor him for his distinguished 18-years of service as Fire Chief with the City of Waterloo and dedicated service to the residents of Waterloo; and

WHEREAS, Chief Butzine began with the City of Waterloo Fire Department in 1980, beginning as a firefighter, then an EMT and working his way through the officer ranks to finally serve as Fire Chief. Chief Butzine served as Fire Chief from June of 1998 through January of 2004 and again from January of 2007 through January of 2019; and

WHEREAS, Chief Butzine accomplished many projects throughout his terms as Chief. In 1998 the current fire station was completed. He helped hire full-time staff, pay for EMS personnel was implemented and started an EMS Auxiliary. A training center and storage shed were built with non-taxpayer dollars with improvements made every year. He helped in getting the workout area for members. He sat on numerous interview committees for other departments. In 2008 he helped to implement the Waterloo Fire & EMS Supporters, Inc. 501(c)(3) for fundraising purposes. He was helpful in forming the present Interview Committee consisting of Fire & EMS members and was involved in the purchasing of all the trucks that are housed at the station presently; and

WHEREAS, Chief Butzine's services extend beyond the Waterloo Fire Department. He is a member of the Wisconsin State Fire Chiefs Association, Jefferson County Fire Chiefs Association, International Association of Fire Chiefs, Jefferson County Firefighters Association – served as President and Vice President, Wisconsin EMS Association, American Heart Association – BLS/CPR Instructor, Arson Investigator through the International Association of Arson Investigators, CEVO (Course for Emergency Vehicle Operators) Instructor, and was the Honorary Runner Up in the Wisconsin State Firefighters Association. Chief Butzine also serves on the Reeseville Fire Commission, the Lowell Fire Commission, Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC), a member of the Waterloo Plan Commission, and a member of the Waterloo United Methodist Church. During his service on the Waterloo Fire Department, Butzine was also a Dance Inspector for the City of Waterloo and then finished school to become a part-time police officer for Waterloo and Marshall Police Departments; and

WHEREAS, over his 39 years of service to the department, of which 31 years were serving as an officer of the department, Chief Butzine has displayed the highest example of character, ethics, morals and unselfish service. Chief Butzine is proud to announce that he is the first Chief to have three generations now serving on the department. Also, there were 7 family members on the department roster at the same time. Chief Butzine states - "Without Family There Would Be No Department – It Takes Backing from the Whole Family"; and

WHEREAS, on behalf of the entire City Council, I want to express our sincere appreciation to Vern for his loyalty to the City of Waterloo and wish him much happiness as he begins this exciting new chapter in his life. Monday February 4th, 2019

On Monday January 14th, 2019 we had our monthly EMS training. Training was in three parts which consisted of CPR updates; Overdoses (med review) and COPD (airway management). CPR updates were for members that needed to be updated and to review Team lead CPR. Overdoses was to inform the members of the rising types of overdoses that are happening and what our members need to complete. Also, to explain the reactions that the medications will do to the patients. COPD was to go over what procedures need to be completed, how to place the CPAP mask and how to use it properly for patient comfort.

On Monday January 21st, 2019 we had our monthly Fire training. Training was Ice Rescue. For this training we went out to Hubbleton to gain access to the Crawfish River ice. The ice was thin enough in the middle to break through for the training. This is a team effort and there has to be good communication to complete the rescue. Two members will be suited up in our ice water rescue suits and they have to be tied off with rescue rope. The members that are on shore are the ones that are going to pull the rescuer and the victim to shore.

On Monday January 21st, 2019 we had elections for the Chief position. Chief Vern Butzine announced that he was going to step down from the Chief's position but still remain on the Department. Voted in as new Chief was Asst. Chief Wesley Benisch and Captain Chad Butzine was voted in as the Asst. Chief.

On Monday January 28th, 2019 at the Officers meeting the decision was made to have existing officers move up a position and Ryan Weber has been appointed to the 2nd Lieutenant position for the remainder of the term.

ORDINANCE #2019-01

AN ORDINANCE STRIKING AND RECREATING SECTION 350-13 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE <u>OFF-ROAD VEHICLES</u> – AUTHORIZING THE USE OF ALL TERRAIN VEHICLES AND UTILITY TERRAIN VEHICLES ON ROADWAYS AND CITY OWNED PROPERTY

The Common Council of the City of Waterloo, Wisconsin does hereby ordain as follows:

SECTION 1: Ordinance §350-13 Off Road Vehicles is hereby struck and recreated as follows:

- A. Intent. The City of Waterloo adopts the following all-terrain vehicle trails and routes for the operation of all-terrain vehicles and utility terrain vehicles upon roadways and city owned property throughout Waterloo. Following due consideration of the recreational value to connect trail opportunities and weighed against the possible dangers, public health, liability aspects, terrain involved, traffic density and history of automobile traffic, these routes and trails have been created
- B. State Laws Adopted. The statutory provision in Wis. Stat. Chapters 23.33 and 340 to 348, establishing definitions and regulations with respect to ATVs and UTVs, and Wis. Admin. Code, Chapter NR 64 are hereby adopted and by reference made a part of this chapter as if fully set forth herein. Unless otherwise provided in this chapter, any act required to be performed or prohibited by any statute incorporated herein is hereby required or prohibited by this ordinance. Any future amendments, revisions or modifications of the statutes incorporated herein are made a part of this chapter in order to secure uniform statewide regulation of ATVs and UTVs.

C. Definitions.

- a. Off road vehicles. Shall include, but not be limited to, minibikes, all-terrain vehicles, and utility terrain vehicles.
- b. All-terrain vehicle (ATV). A commercially designed and manufactured motor-driven device that has a weight, without fluids, of 900 pounds or less, has a width of 50 inches or less, is equipped with a seat designed to be straddled by the operator, and travels on 3 or more low-pressure tires and non-pneumatic tires.
- c. Utility terrain vehicle (UTV). Means any of the following:
 - i. A commercially designed and manufactured motor driven device that does not meet federal motor vehicle safety standards in effect on July 1, 2012, that is not a golf cart, low-speed vehicle, dune buggy, mini-truck, or tracked vehicle, that is designed to be used primarily off of a highway, and that has, and was originally manufactured with, all the following:
 - 1. A weight, without fluids, of 2,000 pounds or less.
 - 2. Four or more low-pressure tires or non-pneumatic tires.
 - 3. A cargo box installed by the manufacturer.
 - 4. A steering wheel.
 - 5. A taillight.
 - 6. A brake light.
 - 7. Two headlights.
 - 8. A width of not more than 65 inches.

- A system of seat belts, or similar system, for restraining each occupant of the device in the event of an accident.
- 10. A system of structural members designed to reduce the likelihood that an occupant would be crushed as a result of a rollover of the device.
- ii. A commercially designed and manufactured motor driven device to which all the following applies: All other applicable words or phrases defined within chapter §23.33, Wis. Stats., and Ch. 340.01, Wis. Stats., are incorporated within this ordinance.
 - 1. It has a weight, without fluids, of more than 900 pounds but not more than 2,000.
 - 2. It has a width of 50 inches or less.
 - 3. It is equipped with a seat designed to be straddled by the operator.
 - 4. It travels on 3 or more low-pressure tires or non-pneumatic tires.
- d. All ATV/UTV vehicle trail. Means a marked corridor on public property or on private lands subject to public easement or lease, designated for use by all-terrain vehicle or utility terrain vehicle operators by the governmental agency having jurisdiction, but excluding roadways of highways except those roadways that are seasonally not maintained for motor vehicle traffic.
- D. Regulated. No person shall operate an off-road vehicle on any City Street, alley, park, or parking lot: on any public lands or parking lots held open to the public; or on any land zoned residential within the City except as provided below:
 - Designation of All-Terrain and Utility Terrain Vehicle Routes. Pursuant to State Law S. 23.33(11) All City streets and roads are designated as all-terrain and utility terrain vehicle routes.
 - b. Conditions of Operation: In addition to the provisions in Wis. Stat. Chapters §23.33, and Chapters. 340 to 348, Wis. Stats, the following conditions apply:
 - All ATV/UTV vehicle route. Means a highway or sidewalk designated for use by all-terrain vehicle or utility terrain vehicle operators by the governmental agency having jurisdiction as authorized under this section.
 - c. The City of Waterloo reserves the right to close or modify routes and trails at any time.
 - The City of Waterloo or its designee shall maintain all route and trail signs within the City of Waterloo.
 - e. All ATV/UTV routes and trails shall be signed in accordance with NR 64.12, and NR 64.12(7)(c).
 - f. All City of Waterloo streets and alleys are designated ATV/UTV trails and routes, not including streets that are also designated as county highways, state trunk highways, or connecting highways unless Jefferson County and/or the Department of Transportation approves or is required to approve the designation. Per Wis. Stats. 23.33 (11)(am)(4), all highways that have a speed limit of 35 miles per hour or less and that are located within the territorial boundaries of the City of Waterloo shall also be designated ATV/UTV trails and routes.
 - g. Conditions of Route Use. As a condition for the use of these trails and routes, the following conditions shall apply to all operators and passengers as applicable:
 - i. All ATV/UTV units shall be registered in accordance with WI DNR regulations.
 - All ATV/UTV operators shall observe all applicable rules of the road governing motorized vehicles on municipal streets in accordance with Wis. Stats. Chapter 346 and Wis. Stats.23.33.
 - iii. No ATV/UTV shall be operated at a speed greater than the posted street speed limit unless posted otherwise.
 - iv. All operators of ATVs or UTVs are subject to Wis. Stats. and/or DNR rules and regulations pertaining to age, safety and safety certificate requirements.

- v. No ATV/UTV may be operated on any designated trail or route without fully functional headlights, taillights and brake lights. Operators must display a lighted headlight and taillight at all times while on the trail or route.
- vi. All ATV/UTV operators shall ride single file.
- vii. ATV/UTVs may be operated on paved roadway surfaces only.
- viii. No ATV/UTV may be operated on any designated route between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. daily, unless otherwise authorized by the Chief of Police.
- ix. ATV/UTVs that do not meet Wisconsin State or local noise pollution requirements may not be operated on any trail or route.
- x. Operation within any municipal park unless specifically designated is prohibited.
- xi. Operation on any sidewalk unless specifically designated is prohibited.
- xii. No person shall leave or allow any ATV owned or operated by him/herself to remain unattended on any public highway or public property while the motor is running or with the starting key left in the ignition. Insurance is required for all ATVs/UTVs operated within the City of Waterloo.
- xiii. DOT. Approved protective helmets will be worn for all operators and passengers of any ATV/UTV for persons under the age of 18 years old.
- xiv. A Valid Department of Transportation driver's license is required to operate any ATV/UTV.
- h. In accordance with Wis. Stat. §23.33 (11)(am)(3), the operation of ATVs and UTVs is permitted on a highway, bridge that is not part of the national system of interstate and defense highways, that is 1,000 feet in length or less, and is located within the territorial boundaries of the City of Waterloo, regardless of whether the City of Waterloo has jurisdiction over the highway, provided that a person crossing a bridge shall do all the following:
 - Cross the bridge in the most direct manner practicable and at a place where no obstruction prevents a quick and safe crossing;
 - ii. Stay as far to the right of the roadway or shoulder as practicable;
 - iii. Stop the vehicle prior to the crossing;
 - iv. Yield the right-of-way to other vehicles, pedestrians, and electric personal assistive mobility devices using the roadway or shoulder; and
 - v. Exit the highway as quickly and safely as practicable after crossing the bridge.

SECTION 2: This ordinance shall take effect and be inforce after its passage and publication in a manner provided for by law.
