#### Hi Chad,

If you're not already aware, the school district is planning an expansion and redevelopment to be complete in Aug. 2020. As part of this project, the school would like to address safety concerns regarding pedestrians crossing Monroe Street (STH 89). We started a conversation with the state and determined the addition of flashing beacon crosswalk signs and dynamic speed display signs makes sense. The school initially wanted to discuss stops signs or traffic signals but that appears to involve a much more difficult and lengthy process.

Any new traffic signage in the STH 89 right of way must be applied for and owned by the local municipality. The next steps involve discussing/confirming a layout with the state, filling out the required permit, and constructing the signage. We can provide our state contact information and give guidance on the required application. Is this something you and the City are receptive to taking on?





\$300,000 Injury or death of one person; \$1,000,000 for any one accident; \$50,000 for Property Damage.

3. The City of Waterloo must be named on the Certificate of Insurance as **primary, non-contributory additional insured** under the general liability policy for the event.

4. The Certificate of Insurance must include the name of the special event, and the date, time and location of the event.

5. The City of Waterloo reserves the right to request a copy of the actual policy represented by the Certificate of Insurance.

6. No event will be allowed to proceed without receipt by the City of a valid Certificate of Insurance in full compliance with the above listed requirements.




