CITY OF WATERLOO COMMON COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES: June 6, 2019

CALL TO ORDER, PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE AND ROLL CALL. Council President Thomas called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. in the Mayor's absence. Alderpersons present: Schoenwetter, Rhynes, Kuhl, Griffin, Thomas, Stinnett and Petts. Absent: none. Others present: WLOO videographers; Diane Graff, the Courier; Police Chief Denis Sorenson; Public Works Director Chad Yerges; Assistant Public Works Director Jeff Robbins; Utility Superintendent Barry Sorenson; Parks Coordinator Gabe Haberkorn; Scott Schoenherr; James Rhyner; Mary Walters-Rhyner; Jim Jermain; Dan Kalina and Clerk/Treasurer Mo Hansen. The pledge of allegiance was recited.

MEETING MINUTES APPROVAL: May 16, 2019 Open & Closed Session; May 9, 2019 Closed Session. MOTION: Moved by Petts, seconded by Schoenwetter to approve the minutes as listed. VOICE VOTE: Motion carried with Stinnett abstaining.

PUBLIC COMMENT. None.

MEETING SUMMARIES - SINCE LAST COUNCIL MEETING

- a. 2019-05-29 Board of Review. Hansen said no citizen objections to property assessments were heard.
 A 2021 property revaluation was discussed.
- 2019-05-28 Plan Commission. Petts said a cell tower recommendation was forwarded to the City Council.
- c. 2019-05-23 Board of Zoning Appeals. Schoenwetter said a Jeff & Cindy Tate proposal for warehousing/storage between the grocery store and the pharmacy was tabled for sixty days.
- d. 2019-05-21 Community Development Authority. No meeting due to the lack of a quorum.
- e. 2019-05-20 Karl Junginger Memorial Library Board. Stinnett promoted the summer reading program and said an emergency meeting to replace failing air conditioners was held. A/C repairs were estimated at \$22,000.

RECOMMENDATIONS OF BOARDS, COMMITTEES & COMMISSIONS

- a. Utility Commission
 - Resolution #2019-15 Review Of The Annual Wastewater Treatment Plant Compliance Maintenance Report. MOTION: Moved by Stinnett, seconded by Petts to approve the resolution as presented. VOICE VOTE: Motion carried.
- b. Finance. Insurance & Personnel Committee
 - ii. Resolution #2019-16 Waiving Impact Fees For The 2019 Waterloo School District Facility Improvements. Griffin said the committee recommended a waiver. Jim Rhyner asked, from where would replacement dollars for waived fee revenue come? He said the waiver meant city taxpayers were covering expenses that non-city school district taxpayers otherwise would be contributing to. Petts asked if the School District had budgeted for expenses properly. Stinnett said District expenses for traffic control improvements roughly equaled the waiver amount. MOTION: Moved by Stinnett, seconded by Kuhl to approve the resolution as presented. VOICE VOTE: Motion carried.
- c. Plan Commission
 - iii. Application For Conditional Use Permit, SAC Wireless On Behalf Of AT&T (Owner City Of Waterloo), 333 Portland Road, To Allow For The Construction Of A 260' Self Support Telecommunications Tower. MOTION: Moved by Petts, seconded by Kuhl to approve the conditional use as submitted. DISCUSSION; Jim Jermain representing AT&T commented on cell service improvements and the First Net program benefitting first responders. Griffin inquired about the twelve foot access easement. Responding to a Jim Rhyner question, Hansen said WisDOT had denied access from STH 19 and the easement would not prevent others from using the easement area. Scott Schoenherr asked if ruts created on his property due to construction would be leveled. In reply to a Schoenherr question, Dan Kalina representing AT&T said the proposed tower was self-supporting and had no guy wires. In reply to a Schoenherr question Jermain said the FCC publishes a municipal guide to RF levels which AT&T follows. In response to a Rhynes question, Kalina said FAA lighting requirements were not yet known, but the tower would be lighted. Replying to Schoenherr, Jermain said AT&T had checked existing Waterloo towers to see if they met the company's location needs, and they did not. VOICE VOTE: Motion carried.

- a. Amending An Existing Ground Lease Agreement Between The City of Waterloo And New Cingular Wireless PCS, LLC For A Telecommunications Tower At 333 Portland Road. MOTION: Moved by Kuhl, seconded by Petts to approve amending the ground lease as presented in a revised form submitted and before the Council this evening. DISCUSSION: Hansen described the amendment to a previously approved ground lease as consisting of a location change and two provisions sought by Alder Schoenwetter: a 27% increase in rental income and the inclusion of language similar Jefferson County agreements regarding a bond in case of tower abandonment. VOICE VOTE: Motion carried.
- b. Resolution #2019-17 Authorizing Tax Incremental District #3 Expenses For Wetland Delineation And Geotechnical Analysis Relating To Reuse And Redevelopment Of 333 Portland Road. MOTION: Moved by Petts, seconded by Schoenwetter to approve the resolution as presented. In reply to a Petts question, Hansen said the Mayor had agreed to fast-track the work in advance of the June CDA meeting. Roll Call Vote: Ayes: Schoenwetter, Rhynes, Kuhl, Thomas, Stinnett and Petts. Noes: none with Griffin abstaining.
- c. Class A & B Beer, Liquor & Cider License Applications For The License Period 7/1/2019 6/30/2020. MOTION: Moved by Petts, seconded by Griffin to approve the licenses. VOICE VOTE: Motion carried.
- d. Cigarette License Applications For the License Period From 7/1/2019 6/30/2020. MOTION: Moved by Petts, seconded by Stinnett to approve the licenses. VOICE VOTE: Motion carried.

Wednesday May 1st, 2019

On Monday April 8th, 2019 we had our monthly EMS training. We had two guest speakers. The first was a family that lives in our district whose child has a skin condition. They came down to speak with us on how to work with this child and how to handle the child. The second speaker was talking with us about autistic patients. We need to know how to interact and be able to help these patients.

On Monday April 15th, 2019 we had our monthly Fire training. First part was on rural operations and MPO (Manual Pump Operator) skills. Our members have to be able to set up to draft and the MPO needs to be able to get that water from a portable tank. Second part was on stretching a hand line. The firefighter has to be able to grab 200 feet of hose, stretch the hose and be ready to go into the structure all within one minute. The last part was on firefighter CPR. If a firefighter would go down with all their gear on we need to be able to perform CPR. The firefighters would take off the downed firefighter's helmet, mask, hood, gloves, SCBA (self-contained breathing apparatus), coat, boots and pants within one minute while doing CPR.

On Monday April 29th, 2019 we had our quarterly combination training. This training was on RTF (Rescue Task Force). This training is for the situations involving mass killings. Trek Bicycle Corporation allowed us to utilize some of their office space for this training. We used live victims, some staff from Trek and some were from the public. Without having these people volunteer their time we would not be able to complete this training. We train with our police department on this type of situation. We go in with police officers to tend to wounds and get the injured out and in a safe location.

Three members completed and got their Firefighter II certification, this course is 42 hours. One member completed and passed the Ambulance Driver course, this course is 18 hours. We have a new EMS member, this member will be starting EMT (Emergency Medical Technician) class at the end of May.

Monday June 3rd, 2019

On Monday May 13th, 2019 we had our monthly EMS training. First part of training was allergic reactions. Patients can present so many different types of reactions from food, animals, plants and medications and some other things also. Our members have to figure out what to do and what medications they need to give for these patients. Second part was diabetes. Our members have to know what the signs are of a diabetic emergency and then how to test it and proceed with medications. The last part was on Haz-mat. The members were called out to a semi that was pulled over and the patient had some white substance on them. The team has to figure out what the chemical is and have fire department dispatch to help secure the scene and decon. Then the EMS needs to know how to use the Emergency Response Guidebook to know how to take care of the patient.

On Monday May 20th, 2019 we had our monthly Fire training. First part was aerial set up and attack. The Aerial Operator had to figure out the best place to set up for rescue and fire attack. Firefighters had to climb the ladder and clip in. Second part rural setup. The team had to get the portable tank off the truck, set up and then get the hard suction connected and placed in the tank and spraying water within two minutes. The last part was checking out turnout gear to make sure there were no problems with it. The members have to take the turn out gear apart and check it for wear and tear.

One of our members completed the EMR (Emergency Medical Responder) course. Two of our members started an EMT (Emergency Medical Technician) course.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the following roads described herein are partially located within the Town and City and are hereinafter referred to as the "City-Town Border Roads;" and

WHEREAS, the Town desires to retain the services of the City to perform certain maintenance of the City-Town Border Roads on its behalf and the City likewise desires to retain the services of the Town to perform certain maintenance of the City-Town Border Roads on its behalf; and

WHEREAS, the City and Town are willing to provide such services upon the terms and conditions set forth herein.

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, as well as other good and valuable consideration moving from each party to the other, it is hereby agreed as follows:

- 1. <u>Recitals.</u> The recitals hereto are hereby incorporated by reference.
- 2. <u>Description of Roads for Which the City will be providing maintenance service.</u> See Exhibit 1.
- 3. <u>Description of Roads for Which the Town will be providing maintenance service.</u> See Exhibit 1.
- 4. Scope of Services and Addition of Roads. During the term of this Agreement, the City and Town agree to perform snow/ice removal services, more particularly described on Exhibit 2 attached hereto and incorporated herein (the "Services"). The City shall perform the Services in the same manner and to the same extent as it performs such Services on public roads located within its geographic boundaries, as they may exist from time to time. Likewise the Town shall perform the Services in the same manner and to the same extent as it performs such Services on public roads located within its geographic boundaries.

It is noted that all other road maintenance tasks including but not limited to: replacement and maintenance of road signs, road repair and similar tasks are the responsibility of the respective governing bodies, and will be subject to this agreement.

5. <u>Term of Agreement.</u> The term of this Agreement shall commence upon its execution hereof by both parties, and shall continue indefinitely thereafter and unless and until terminated in the manner provided for herein. This Agreement shall terminate upon the expiration of thirty (30) days prior written notice of termination from one party to

the other, in the event the termination is without cause. In the event a party desires to terminate this agreement with cause, then in such event, the written notice shall be given by the terminating party to the defaulting party, specifying the nature of the particular default. The defaulting party shall then have a period, not to exceed ten (10) days, within which to cure the default. Notwithstanding the foregoing, in the event the default is one of a monetary nature, then the notice of default and opportunity to cure shall be shortened to a three (3) day period.

- 6. <u>Compensation.</u> For and in consideration of the Services described herein, the Town shall compensate the City in the amount zero dollars (\$0.00) with the understanding that the Town agrees to maintain road segments as described herein. Neither party shall compensate the other for the maintenance of roadway services as noted on Exhibit 1.
- 7. <u>Indemnification.</u> Each party hereto agrees to indemnify, save and hold harmless the other form and against any and all claims, suits, demands or causes of action, arising out of, directly or indirectly, any act or omission of the indemnifying party, which may cause injury or damage to any person or persons or property, whomsoever or whatsoever. The parties intend that the indemnification be mutual in all respects.
- 8. <u>Binding Effect</u>. This Agreement is binding on the successors and assigns of the parties hereto.
- 9. <u>Notice</u>. Any notice or offer or demand required to be sent hereunder shall be sent by registered United States mail, return receipt requested, addressed to the respective parties at:
