Wednesday December 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2020

On Monday October 5<sup>th</sup>, 2020 we had our monthly MPO training. Training was on relay and set up for rural fire. First in engine gets in position and then the first in tender comes in behind the engine connects a 2 ½ in hose and pumps to the engine while they are setting up the portable tank. The initial attack will then have 4000 to 5000 gallons of water right away. The second tender will come and dump in the portable tank, which is to minimize time and hopefully save more life and property.

On Monday October 12<sup>th</sup>, 2020 we had our monthly EMS training. Our Medical Director completed QA with our past calls. Also, we have new equipment and medication that we went over. We were trained with Nitrous Oxide for pain control. Our Medical Director went over the protocol and how we should be using it. We also had the sales rep. come out and demonstrate how to put the equipment together to use the Nitrous Oxide.

On Monday October 19<sup>th</sup>, 2020 we had our monthly Fire training. Training was in three parts. First part was on VES (Vent Enter Search), which is a single room search. The member enters through the window shuts the door and completes a search. The second part was confined space and entanglement, where the members went through a maze of tight spaces and wires with having all there equipment on with being on air. The third part was SCBA and turnout gear checks, where the members had to describe everything on the SCBA and went through their turnout gear to make sure there is no issues with their gear.

Wednesday December 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2020

On Monday November 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2020 we had our monthly MPO training. The new engine has arrived and we had all operators run through the pump and pump with it. The members will have to do much training to get checked off to be able to run the new engine.

On Monday November 9<sup>th</sup>, 2020 we had our monthly EMS training. Training was on OB-GYN issues and complications. The discussions were on Gestational diabetes, hypertension, preeclampsia, eclampsia and seizures. These are the most common complications with pregnant patients and during childbirth.

On Monday November 16<sup>th</sup>, 2020 we had our monthly Fire training. 4 of our members went to a training in Illinois this past weekend and they brought back what they learned from the training. First group one-person ladder placements: One member grabs the roof and extension ladder, puts them together, places what tools they might need, drags it to the structure, puts it up and places it by themselves. The second group was hose deployment: Two members stretch the line around corners and make sure there are no kinks within 20 seconds.

On Monday November 30<sup>th</sup>, 2020 we had our quarterly combination training. There were 4 stations. The first station was pit crew CPR, which is where there is a pulseless non breathing patient and members get in roles to do CPR. The second station was triaging for rescue task force, where the members have to check over a patient and decide how critical that patient is and place them in a specific color. The third station was stop the bleed, where the members have to know how to put a tourniquet on, pack a wound with special gauze, put an emergency bandage on and place a nasal airway. The fourth station was RTF (Rescue Task Force) gear and how to move in an active killing scenario, where the members need to know how to put on the gear quickly and know how to use all the equipment on the gear. Our members are escorted in the warm zone with Law Enforcement Officers. The Officers are there to protect us when we take care of the patients that are wounded.

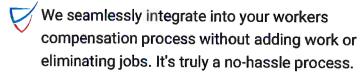

# Amending Chapter 332 <u>Trees</u> and Chapter 317 <u>Solid Waste</u> As They Relate To The Disposal Of Wood And Trees

[ presented in redline form for Committee and Council consideration ]

### CHAPTER 332 TREES IS AMENDED AS SHOWN IN RED.

[HISTORY: Adopted by the Common Council of the City of Waterloo 10-19-1987 by Ord. No. 87-6 as §§ 8.14 and 8.20 of the 1987 Code. Amendments noted where applicable.]

# § 332-1 Committee responsible for trees. [Amended 2-15-2007 by Ord. No. 2007-03]

The Public Works and Property Committee shall, subject to the supervision and control of the Council, and except as herein provided, have jurisdiction and direction over all trees planted and growing in and upon City-owned property; that part of every street, the grade of which has been established, lying between the lot line and the curb; and trees on any property which may in any way have effect upon public property and upon the public welfare of the City, and for the planting, care, maintenance, protection and removal thereof. The Committee may make such rules and regulations as it may deem advisable for carrying out the purpose of this chapter.

# § 332-2 Tree trimming. [Amended 2-15-2007 by Ord. No. 2007-03]

Trees standing in and upon any public street or place, or upon any lot or land adjacent thereto, and having branches projecting into the public street or place shall, under the supervision of the Committee, be kept trimmed by the owner or owners or occupants of the property on or in front of which such trees are growing so that the lowest branches projecting over the public street or alley will provide a clearance of not less than 14 feet and over all other places not less than nine feet from the ground. This provision shall not apply to newly planted trees, provided that they do not interfere with persons upon the public street or place or obstruct the light of any streetlight. Any tree or trees not trimmed, as herein provided, shall be deemed hazardous.

Wood disposal. Any wood from trees growing on City property, including tree lawns, which are designated by the City Forester to be cut and removed, shall be the property of the City and shall be disposed of appropriately or stacked and stored for the purpose of resale to the highest bidder.

### § 332-3 Tree planting.

- A. Permit required. No trees, except the types recommended by the Committee, shall be planted in or upon any public street or place. Trees shall be planted only after a written permit has been received from the Committee, which permit shall state the name of the applicant, his address, the property on which the trees are to be planted, and the type to be planted. The trees shall be planted in such manner that they shall be equidistant between the curbline and the sidewalk. The distance between the trees shall not be less than 35 feet.
- B. Trees on newly opened streets. On newly opened streets, the Tree Committee shall have the authority to designate the types of trees and the manner in which they shall be planted and such other shrubs and

bushes as the Committee shall approve.

C. Trees planted in the public right-of-way shall be planted no closer than 40 feet to the nearest intersection or 10 feet to any driveway opening, buried cable or other utility. No permit will be issued if the tree lawn, defined as the public right-of-way between a public street and a public sidewalk, is less than six feet wide. Similarly, no permit will be issued for the planting of a tree beneath utility lines. [Added 2-20-2014 by Ord. No. 2014-02]

### § 332-4 Removal of trees and stumps; replacement of trees.

- A. All dead, hazardous and infected trees in the public right-of-way will be removed by the City at the expense of the City. All other trees in the public right-of-way shall be removed at the expense of the owner of the abutting property. If trees are removed by the owner of the abutting property, he shall cause all stumps to be removed and the area cleaned of all branches, leaves and other debris. If such is not done in a manner satisfactory to the Tree Committee, the Committee may order the Director of Public Works to do so and may charge the expense to the abutting property, pursuant to § 66.0627, Wis. Stats.
- B. If a tree is removed from a tree lawn less than six feet wide, a tree will be provided by the City at 50% of the municipal cost to property owners and will be planted on the property owner's front lawn, providing that the Public Works Director determines that the property has sufficient front yard space to accommodate a tree. All municipally provided trees shall become the full responsibility of the property owner. [Added 2-20-2014 by Ord. No. 2014-02]

### § 332-5 Trespass on private land.

This chapter shall not give the Tree Committee authority to trespass on private land without the consent of the owner.

### § 332-6 Violations and penalties.

The penalty for violation of any provision of this chapter shall be a penalty as provided in Chapter 1, § 1-4 of this Code. A separate offense shall be deemed committed on each day on which a violation of this chapter occurs or continues.

### CHAPTER 317 SOLID WASTE IS AMENDED AS SHOWN IN RED.

Chapter 317 **Solid Waste** (§ 317-22)

# $\S$ 317-22 Management of lead-acid batteries, major appliances, waste oil, grease, waste tires and yard waste.

Persons enrolled in the City-provided program shall dispose of these items as follows:

- A. Lead-acid batteries shall be placed at curbside, separated from solid waste, for collection by the City's contractor. Car, truck and other automotive batteries only shall be accepted. Battery casings must be unbroken.
- B. Major appliances shall be placed at curbside, separated from solid waste, for collection by the City's contractor. Appliances shall be upright and empty and doors removed from refrigerators and freezers. Residents must make arrangements with the City's contractor for collection of all appliances. Those not

enrolled in the City-provided program must arrange for private collections through a qualified scrap metal hauler.

- C. Waste oil shall be placed at curbside and separated from solid waste. Common engine oil only shall be accepted. No antifreeze or hazardous material shall be accepted. The waste oil must be in leakproof, nonbreakable containers of one-gallon maximum size.
- D. Cooking grease from residential properties enrolled in the program shall be placed at the curbside in a sealed container in a solid or liquid form. Alternately, grease in liquid form can be disposed of after being absorbed into wood shavings, cat litter or a similar absorbing compound and presented for pickup in a sealed container.
- E. Waste tires from automobiles and light trucks, separated from the rim, shall be placed at the curbside and separated from solid waste for collection by the City's contractor.
- F. Disposal of yard wastes.
- (1) No yard wastes shall be disposed of through regular City refuse collection.
- (2) It shall be the responsibility of every City resident and property owner to take steps to dispose of their accumulated yard wastes through on-site use, recycling composting or through other lawful means. The City shall provide a yard waste drop-off location designated by the Public Works Director for the purposes of recycling and composting. Grass clippings, leaves, and leafy materials may be transported to the yard waste disposal site by City residents and deposited in the designated areas. Clean brush and woody vegetation may not be taken to the drop-off site. Branches, branch clippings and brush may be transported to the yard waste disposal point by City residents and deposited in the designated area. Broken concrete materials, rocks, and blacktop materials, not to exceed one cubic yard in aggregate, may be transported by City residents and deposited in the designated area. The drop-off location shall be open to use by the public during hours established by the Public Works Director.
- (3) The Director of Public Works is authorized to conduct special curbside collections of yard wastes at such times of the year as determined by the Director of Public Works.
- (4) Only items which are readily compostable shall be placed into areas designated for yard wastes as defined herein.
- (5) Waste tires from automobiles and light trucks, separated from the rim, shall be placed at the curbside and separated from solid waste for collection by the City's contractor.

### 2020 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY ANNUAL REPORT

### **COMPOSITION & ORGANIZATION:**

Chairperson: Angie Stinnett Vice Chairperson: Rich Weihert

[NOTE: A roster as of 12/15/2020 is attached for reference.]

The Community Development Authority ("CDA") met once a month except for January, March, April and November. Meetings were held in Council Chambers with most participating remotely. The Clerk/Treasurer provided staff support.

### **POWERS AND DUTIES:**

As granted by Chapter 35 of the municipal code, the CDA shall have all powers and duties in §§ 66.1333 Wis. Stats. (Operating as a Redevelopment Authority for the purposes of blight elimination and slum clearance). Furthermore, it shall have all powers and duties in §§ 66.1201 Wis. Stats. (Run municipal housing projects; none currently). The CDA also has the powers, duties and functions related to community development as are conferred upon it by the Common Council. This most recent ordinance changes have assigned authority relating to Tax Incremental Finance to the CDA.

### **GOALS & OBJECTIVES:**

CDA received monthly reports reporting on its goals and objectives. [NOTE: A progress report is attached for reference.]

### **ACTIVITIES:**

- 1. <u>Jefferson County Home Buyer Program Review</u>. The CDA reviewed options available to citizens through this County program.
- 2. <u>Parks & Cable TV Road Map Review</u>. The CDA received input from the Parks Coordinator and Cable TV Station Manager which focused on improving coordination with the School District.
- 3. <u>Redevelopment/Reuse of 203 East Madison Street.</u> The CDA advanced this redevelopment project incrementally over the twelve months.

- a. A concept and estimate were provided by Kunkel Engineering Group early in the year.
- b. CDA Member Garry Whitebird collaborated with Gabe Haberkorn on a Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources Stewardship Fund grant application resulting in 50% funding for the acquisition of private property adjacent to the site.
- c. In August, the Clerk/Treasurer submitted a background report on Yahara Trailhead design attributes, a De Forest location with similarities to the Waterloo site. It was also funded in part by the Department of Natural Resources Stewardship Fund.
- d. The CDA monitored the installation of fencing by the Department of Public Works at this location.
- e. The CDA discussed project funding options.
- f. Mitch Leisses with Kunkel Engineering Group participated in project refinement discussions with the CDA
- g. In October Public Works Director Chad Yerges submitted a concept design to advance the project design.
- 4. 333 Portland Road. CDA members recommended to the City Council
  - a. the sale of a small segment of land to Parker Dow, an adjacent property owner.
  - b. It also recommended the sale of 2+ acres to Ron Griffin. This recommendation did not come to fruition.
  - c. As part of its review of all Tax Incremental Districts, the creation of an internship to assist with the marketing of 333 Portland Road.
- 5. <u>Blight Removal.</u> The CDA reviewed how blight is addressed by municipal government. It recommended the public distribution of a request for proposal for Ordinance Non-Compliance Officer services.
- 6. <u>Clarifying The Citywide Policy For Collection Of Building Permit Fees For Multi-Unit Residential Construction</u>. At the request of the Mayor and Council President, the CDA reviewed the citywide policy for collecting building permit fees.
- 7. <u>122 South Monroe Stree</u>t. It recommended an arrangement by which the City would acquire this foreclosed property from the County and market it for re-sale with the goal of enabling commercial activity at this location.
- 8. <u>Financial Activity and Fund 600 (Community Development Authority)</u>. Revenues and expenses for the CDA are segregated to Fund 600. The CDA was presented with monthly financial statements for this fund as well as Funds 412, 413 and 414 (the three tax incremental finance district funds).
- 9. My 2020 year-end projected fund balance for Fund 600 (CDA) is: \$18,000.

### WINTER ON-STREET PARKING PERMIT APPLICATION - Municipal Code 350-7(G)

Chapter 350: VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC

### § 350-7. Parking restrictions.

- G. Winter parking regulations. No person shall park in any City street or public parking lot in the City between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. from November 15 to April 1, except by permit as set forth in Subsection E or as hereinafter set forth:
  - (1) Overnight parking on City streets may be allowed by permit only. The permit fee shall be as stated in the City of Waterloo Fee Schedule for each winter season from November 15 to April 1. Editor's Note: The Fee Schedule is on file at the office of the City Clerk-Treasurer.
  - (2) Permits for winter on-street parking shall be issued only on the basis of unusual need for vehicles owned by City residents residing on property which does not have a driveway, lacks sufficient space to provide for off-street parking and does not have a reasonable alternative for overnight parking.
  - (3) Permit applications are to be obtained, completed and paid for at the office of the Clerk-Treasurer. Applications shall be submitted to the Council for review and granting or denial.
  - (4) The permit shall be displayed as required on the permit whenever a vehicle is parked on the City street overnight from November 15 to April 1. Failure to display the permit, as required, shall result in vehicle parking violations and subject the vehicle to being towed at the expense of the operator/owner.
