I have been asked by many citizens of Waterloo about the Historic District banners. So, this is directed to the Committee or Commission.... who ever authorized them.

Regardless, the Waterloo United Methodist Church was organized in 1854 with a wood structure on the same spot the brick Church is existing today. I would suggest a banner to be placed near the Church on 348 W. Madison St. Possibly a banner on downtown W. Madison St. that is covering some road signage could be transferred to the 348 W. Madison area.

I also would suggest that some consistency of banners should be in order. We now have Historic District banners, Veterans' Banners, and sone sort of "floral" banners. Please consider the first two suggested, so many patterns to leads to "visual pollution."

I would also suggest that "Zebra lines" be painted on the "Four Corners" pedestrian area crossing walks as there is no signage depicting pedestrian walking area.

Waterloo Community Cable station 992 screen says, "One Moment please, this channel will be on shortly." After never appearing I called LaRon Davis manager and he reported that programming is on Smart Phones only, as someone from the City reported so many are on the go or traveling that this is preferred. ORDINANCE #2024-09

An Ordinance Amending Section §19-8 Waterloo Water & Light Commission and §19-9 Waterloo Sewer Commission

The Common Council of the City of Waterloo, Wisconsin do ordain as follows:

<u>A.</u> Membership. The Waterloo Water and Light Commission shall consist of five members appointed by the Mayor, subject to confirmation by the Council, for staggered five-year terms, beginning on the first day of October; except for the appointed members who are council members whose terms shall run concurrent with their aldermanic terms.

- a. At least one, but no more than two, voting members shall be a current Council member, who shall be appointed to a one-year term annually.
- b. Four voting members shall be residents of the City of Waterloo appointed to staggered terms.
- c. The Mayor and the Utility Supervisor shall be ex officio nonvoting members.
- d. Commissioners shall receive compensation from the Utility as authorized and approved by city council. Each member shall take the oath required under Wis. Stats. §19.01 which shall be filed with the City Clerk.
- **B.** Powers and duties. The Commission shall be responsible for managing the Water and Light Utility in accordance with policies established by the Council and the provisions of § 66.0805, Wis. Stats., and Chapter **340**, Article **1** of this Code.
- § 19-9 Waterloo Sewer Commission.
- A. Membership. The Waterloo Water and Light Commission shall constitute the Waterloo Sewer Commission.
- <u>B.</u> Powers and duties. The Commission shall be responsible for managing the Sewer Utility in accordance with policies established by the Council and the provisions of Chapter <u>340</u>, Article <u>II</u> of this Code.

Section 2: This ordinance shall take effect and be in force after its passage and publication in a manner provided for by law.

- 1. The City of Waterloo requires submission of a Certificate of Insurance along with the Special or Entertainment Events Application prior to review by the City's Government Operations Committee.
- 2. The Certificate of Insurance must include the following **minimum** limits of insurance coverage required for special events on City property:

\$300,000 Injury or death of one person; \$1,000,000 for any one accident; \$50,000 for Property Damage.

- 3. The City of Waterloo must be named on the Certificate of Insurance as **primary**, **non-contributory additional insured** under the general liability policy for the event.
- 4. The Certificate of Insurance must include the name of the special event, and the date, time and location of the event.
- 5. The City of Waterloo reserves the right to request a copy of the actual policy represented by the Certificate of Insurance.
- 6. No event will be allowed to proceed without receipt by the City of a valid Certificate of Insurance in full compliance with the above listed requirements.

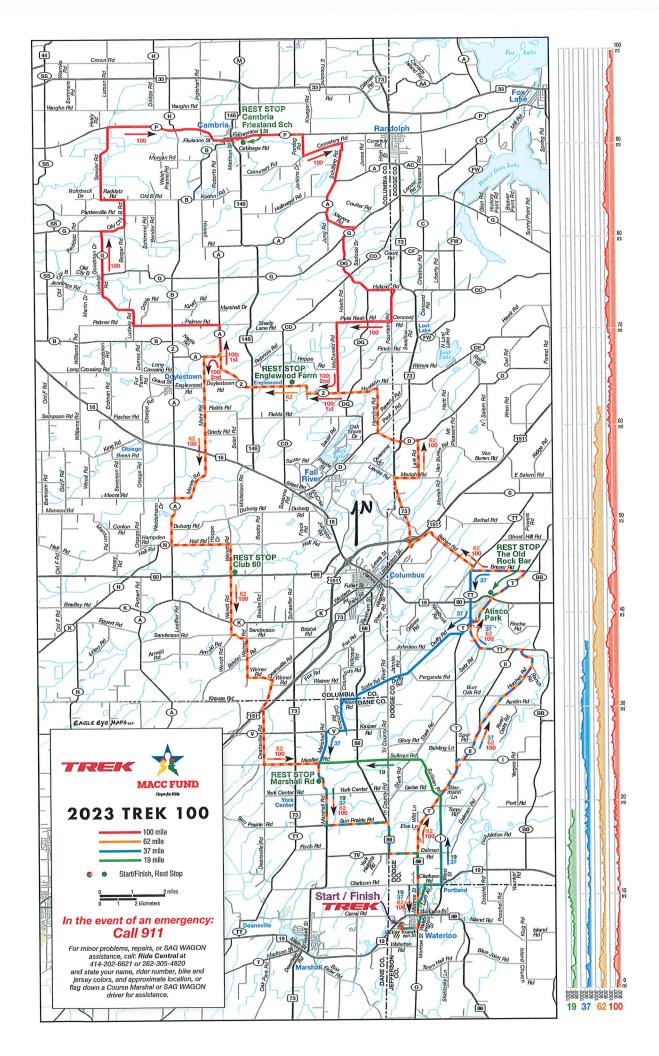

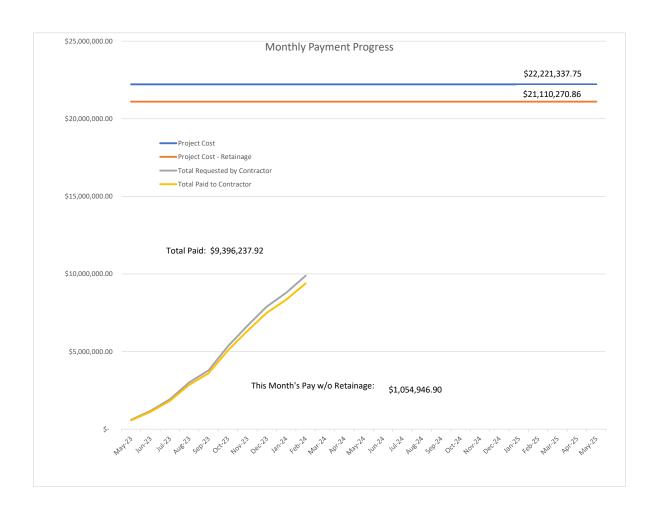

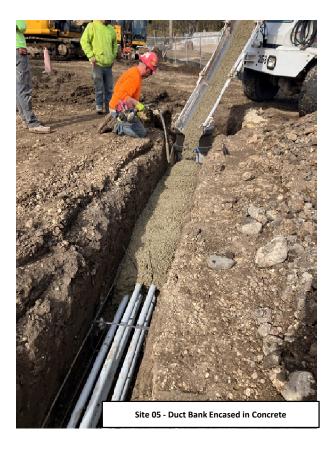
