

#### 200-4. Burning Regulations

#### <u>A.</u>

Outdoor burning prohibited. No person shall cause, allow or permit outdoor burning of refuse, garbage, plant life, leaves or other combustible material within the City, except as permitted under Subsection  $\underline{\mathbf{C}}$ .

#### B.

Incinerators prohibited. It shall be unlawful for any person to operate and maintain or cause to be operated and maintained any incinerator within the City, except as permitted under Subsection **C**.

#### C.

**Exceptions:** 

#### (1)

Outdoor burning in connection with the preparation of food.

#### (2)

The burning of refuse in a properly designed, operated and maintained incinerator, duly licensed by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources to be effective for the purpose of air pollution control, or outdoor burning by the City of Waterloo pursuant to a permit by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources.

#### **(3)**

Small outdoor flames for welding, acetylene torches, safety flares, heating tar or similar applications.

### <u>(4)</u>

Any outdoor burning for which a person has obtained a permit from the Waterloo Fire Department.

#### (5)

A fire set for the purpose of training public or private fire-fighting personnel.

#### (6)

A fire set or required by a public officer for the abatement of nuisances and which is necessary in carrying out public health functions.

### <u>D.</u>

Permit required. (1) One time inspection for any new permanent installation of a fire pit (bricks & mortar, concrete, etc.)

### <del>(1)</del>

The Waterloo Fire Department shall issue a permit for outdoor fires (apply at Waterloo City Hall):

#### <del>(a)</del>

When it can be shown by the applicant that such outdoor burning is necessary and not contrary to the interests of public health; or

#### <del>(b)</del>

When the fire is a campfire or a fire used solely for recreational purposes or for ceremonial occasions.

#### <del>(2)</del>

No permit shall be issued within one year of the date of the prior revocation of an outdoor fire permit previously obtained by the applicant.

#### <del>(3)</del>

This permit shall expire on December 31 of the year issued.

#### <del>(4)</del>

This permit does not allow for the installation of a heating source for any building.

#### <del>(5)</del>

There shall be no annual permit fee.

#### <u>E.</u>

Responsibilities Responsibility of permit holder.

The permit holder Resident shall have the following responsibilities:

### <u>(1)</u>

To adhere to all health and fire prevention codes.

### <u>(2)</u>

To have adult (18 years of age or older) supervisory personnel present at the site of the outdoor burning.

### <u>(3)</u>

To comply with the following conditions: which shall be set forth on the permit issued to the applicant:

### <u>(a)</u>

Any fire deemed to be a public health nuisance by the Fire Chief or his or her designee shall be extinguished.

### <u>(b)</u>

This permit shall apply to all manufactured burning rings, fireplaces, fire pits, chimneys or like devices.

#### (c)

No manufactured device shall be placed on any combustible surface.

#### <u>(d)</u>

The fire must be completely extinguished before the fire location may be left unsupervised.

#### <u>(e)</u>

The fire shall be no larger than four feet in diameter, subject to the exceptions listed below.

#### **(f)**

No flammable liquids shall be used to start or support the burning.

#### (g)

Only virgin wood and charcoal fuel will be allowed to be burned. "Virgin wood" means wood and other wood products, such as bark, but not to include sawdust, which have had no chemical treatments or finishes applied.

#### <u>(h)</u>

Under no circumstances shall plastics, trash, garbage, oils, hydrocarbon fuels, furniture, fabrics, leaves, yard waste, synthetic materials of any kind, pressure-treated wood or wood that has been finished with paints, varnishes, laminates or a similar finish be burned. Burn Barrels are not allowed within the city limits.

### <u>(i)</u>

The fire shall be located at least 10 feet from property lines and at least 20 feet from any building or structure. This does not apply to manufactured devices.

### <u>(j)</u>

A functional extinguishing aid must be present, such as a fire extinguisher, garden hose, etc.

### <u>(4)</u>

Exceptions. A bonfire exceeding the size restrictions set forth in Subsection <u>E(3)(e)</u> will be permitted for churches, organized schools, and civic organizations and only if application for site review has been made and approved by the Waterloo Fire Department. Such bonfire shall be no more than 10 feet in diameter or 10 feet by 10 feet square and no more than six feet high and must comply with all other provisions of the permit.

### <u>F.</u>

Emergency provisions. Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, the Fire Chief, in times of extreme dryness or drought, deficiency in the water supply or by reason of any other emergency, is authorized to prohibit the setting of any fires upon any lands within the City by providing published notice of the declared emergency. and the scope of the

declaration in the local newspaper on the date that the emergency is declared to begin and by providing published notice broadcast through local radio or cable television. Public notice will be made by city wide call (Connect final site) as well as website and social media.

#### 2023 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY ANNUAL REPORT

#### **COMPOSITION & ORGANIZATION:**

The Community Development Authority ("CDA") met once a month except for February and October . Meetings were held in Council Chambers. The Clerk/Treasurer provided staff support. Everett Butzine from Non-Metro is currently the Economic Developer.

#### **POWERS AND DUTIES:**

As granted by Chapter 35 of the municipal code, the CDA shall have all powers and duties in §§ 66.1333 Wis. Stats. (Operating as a Redevelopment Authority for the purposes of blight elimination and slum clearance). Furthermore, it shall have all powers and duties in §§ 66.1201 Wis. Stats. (Run municipal housing projects; none currently). The CDA also has the powers, duties and functions related to community development as are conferred upon it by the Common Council. This most recent ordinance changes have assigned authority relating to Tax Incremental Finance to the CDA.

#### **GOALS & OBJECTIVES:**

CDA received monthly reports reporting on its goals and objectives.

#### **ACTIVITIES:**

- 1. <u>Duqaine Development</u> N Monroe and Clarkson Rd. The developer worked through driveway placement with the DOT and looking into other funding sources.
- 2. Downtown Development Plan Received plan from SEH. Looking into avenues for funding.
- 3. <u>333 Portland Road.</u> Numerous people are interested in property development, but nothing has been submitted.
- 4. <u>Blight Removal.</u> The CDA received monthly updates regarding blight in the city. In 2024 Public Health and Safety will be taking over the blight list.
- 5. <u>Façade Grants</u> Program updated. 3 grants dispersed. Two for 103 N Monroe St. (Kevin Henry) Luminous Rose for exterior and interior totaling \$9,643.00. One for 129 N Monroe St. (Steve Parker) totaling \$5000.00. Total disbursement of \$14,643.00 in 2023
- 6. <u>Maunesha Business Center</u>. During 2023 the building was rented for yoga, art studio, stain glass sales and the Waterloo Business Association meetings.
- 7. <u>Financial Activity and Fund 600 (Community Development Authority)</u>. Revenues and expenses for the CDA are segregated to Fund 600. The CDA was presented with monthly financial statements for this fund as well as Funds 412, 413 and 414 (the three tax incremental finance district funds).

- 8. New TID Created TID 5 created. North end of Waterloo wrapping around to Van Holten area. Will be funded in 2024
- 9. <u>Senior Housing Study</u> Cedar Corp reviewed Waterloo's need for senior housing in Waterloo.
- 10. <u>BID District</u> Discussion of potential BID district in downtown Waterloo.
- 11. The 2023 year-end fund balance for Fund 600 (CDA) is: \$25,000.
